Activities, Handouts and Lesson Plans

Earth Day is on Monday, April 22nd. Here are some environmental and conservation activities you can do with your students for Earth Day:

- Students work in small groups to create an Earth Day poster that represents their ideas for what they can do to be more environmentally friendly on a daily basis.
- Students watch the **Reduce, Reuse and Recycle** video to identify different waste reduction strategies they can use on a daily basis. Discuss which strategies they can implement in their own homes and why.
- Students watch the video <u>PSA Recycling Ad</u> about the lifecycle of a plastic water bottle. Discuss uses for used plastic water bottles. Discuss strategies to reduce the use of bottled water in daily life.
- Take the students around your school and evaluate the school's environmental sustainability initiatives that they can see. Look for recycling, energy saving and water saving initiatives.
- Students watch either <u>Team Marine</u> or <u>Dreaming in Green</u> about two school projects directed towards environmental sustainability. Students create a checklist of ideas from the videos that what they can use in their homes or daily lives.

- Students work in pairs or small groups to play <u>Cornucopia</u>, a free environmental online simulation game. Once students are finished, debrief them about what they learned while playing the game.
- Students research an environmental sustainability initiative and present their research to the class Possible topics include: wind energy, solar energy, geothermal energy, recycling, energy conservation, composting and electric cars.

Leadership Discussions with Random Travellers

I travel a lot and one of the most enjoyable things about this travel is the random people I meet--people sitting next to me in an airport lounge, on a plane, train or bus. Never having met
before, we have great discussions about life, politics, economics, business and education. I get a
wide range of perspectives on all of these topics from people outside of my professional and
personal networks.

One of the most interesting random travellers I met recently was a young (relative to me) engineer in a pipe manufacturing company. He was heading to Vancouver for a meeting at his parent company. He was reading **Make it So: Leadership Lessons from Star Trek: The Next Generation** by Wess Roberts and Bill Ross. Being a Star Trek geek, and particularly a fan of the lead actor, Patrick Stewart, I couldn't resist asking about the book.

The random traveller explained that the authors use an episode from the TV show to make points about leadership as demonstrated by Captain Picard. For example, that leadership is about letting your team do their jobs and trusting their expertise and judgement. And that it is about having to make decisions with incomplete information. And that context is important.

We then talked more about making the transition from being a technical expert, to being a leader and manager. This was his first management position after doing engineering work for five years. He was reading the book to get ideas on how to better navigate his new management responsibilities. We also shared other management and leadership books we had read and found

useful.

The lesson of this post? Keep your eyes and ears open when you travel. You will meet interesting people who will give you little nuggets of information and wisdom to plug into what you already know, about leadership and management, and about life. You never know when you are going to have the opportunity to learn.
