Candidates for this position must provide evidence of, or demonstrate potential for, excellence in research scholarship and success in securing external funding. Candidates must have a strong record of university teaching experience or provide evidence of potential for outstanding teaching contributions at both the pre-service and graduate levels. Preservice teaching responsibilities will be at the primary-junior, junior-intermediate, and/or intermediate-senior levels. Graduate-level teaching and participation in graduate supervision at the M.Ed. and Ph.D. levels are also expectations of the position. Expertise with pedagogical innovation (e.g., hybrid and on-line course delivery), provincial teacher certification (e.g., OCT), and K-12 teaching experience are assets. It is also an expectation of each position for the successful candidate to have, or to develop, in-depth knowledge of relevant Ontario Ministry of Education curricular documents (see <a href="http://www.edu.gov.on.ca/eng/teachers/curriculum.html">http://www.edu.gov.on.ca/eng/teachers/curriculum.html</a>). The successful candidate will also be required to make substantive contributions via service within the Faculty of Education and the University of Windsor and alongside community and professional educational partners. The Faculty of Education at the University of Windsor is committed to continually supporting, promoting and building an inclusive and culturally diverse educational context. We hope to attract applicants who will facilitate success for students from diverse backgrounds. Candidates with a PhD in progress may apply, but must provide evidence that the degree will be completed by the time of appointment. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Candidates for this position must hold a Ph.D. or equivalent in a field related to educational foundations (e.g., cultural foundations of education, curriculum theory, or social/ecological justice education). The successful candidate will be required to teach pre-service courses focused on philosophical orientations to education, law and ethics, classroom practice, and/or school governance. Preferred candidates will have a strong record of, or potential for, peer-reviewed publication in such areas as philosophy, sociology, or history of education, curriculum and instruction, comparative and international education, anti-racist and anti-oppressive education, and/or Indigenous education.

- a detailed and current curriculum vitae;
- a statement of research interests;
- up to three (3) samples of scholarly writing (e.g., journal publications, submitted chapters, or papers presented at professional conferences), including (if applicable) clear indications of your contribution to any jointly authored pieces;
- a teaching dossier or evidence of teaching effectiveness that may include sample course syllabi/outlines, teaching evaluations, and a statement of teaching philosophy and interests (resources and templates for completing a teaching dossier can be found at <a href="http://www.uwindsor.ca/ctl/390/teaching-and-learning-resources">http://www.uwindsor.ca/ctl/390/teaching-and-learning-resources</a>);
- graduate transcripts; and
- three (3) current letters of reference forwarded directly by the referees to the Dean, at the address or email listed below.
