# GRADUATE STUDIES AT UWINDSOR

Graduate students come to UWindsor for many reasons, but all receive opportunities to make important contributions through their research and professional development.

UWindsor is a student-centred university that takes great pride in enabling people to make a better world through education, scholarship, research and engagement.

The University of Windsor began as Assumption College in 1857. It is a non-denominational, medium-sized, comprehensive institution.

Approximately 16,500 undergraduate and graduate students attend programs as diverse as business, engineering, arts and social sciences, education, natural and human sciences, law and nursing.

The university is entering its most ambitious capital expansion since 1963. As part of this expansion, with the help of \$40 million in Ontario government funding, and a matching amount from the federal government, the university has built the 300,000-sq. ft., \$112-million Ed Lumley Centre for Engineering Innovation (CEI), a structure that will establish revolutionary design standards across Canada and beyond. In addition, the university is expanding its campus into the city of Windsor's downtown.

In 2015, the Centre for Executive and Professional Education (CEPE) and the School of Social Work moved into a renovated historical building in the city's core. The School of Creative Arts' departments of Visual Arts, Music, and

Film Production will do the same at another nearby, uniquely refurbished site in the core in 2017.

UWindsor is located at the crossroads of North America, on the border between Canada and the US, near the beautiful Detroit River waterfront. Successive waves of immigration have infused the city of Windsor with a diverse, ethnic population.

This feature, in addition to its location in the major transportation, industrial, and economic artery connecting Canada to the US, means that UWindsor has become an internationally oriented, multi-disciplined institution that actively encourages a broad range of students, faculty and staff. Those strengths vault it to the forefront of Canadian universities in the creation of an awareness and appreciation of difference—differences in ethnic backgrounds, in cultures and in dreams.

From that diversity, the university fosters an atmosphere of close co-operation between faculty and students, creating a unifying atmosphere of excellence across all of its faculties to encourage lifelong learning, teaching, research and discovery. Its basic characteristics of openness, warmth and support make UWindsor an exceptionally welcoming community for students and faculty from around the globe.

UWindsor expects great vision and achievement from its faculty. We are experiencing unprecedented growth in research funding, prominence and success. # SCHOLARSHIPS, AWARDS AND COSTS

## GRADUATE ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

### Who is eligible?

Students who have achieved a first-class standing (80% North American equivalent) entering a full-time eligible master's or PhD program may be considered for these awards. Offers are based on either your completed four-year bachelor's degree if entering a master's program, or your completed master's degree if entering a PhD program.

## GRADUATE ASSISTANTSHIPS (GAS)

### What is a GA?

A graduate assistantship (GA) is a stipend paid to a student to assist with the teaching needs of the department. This can include helping a professor with an undergraduate class, lab or tutorial.

### Who is eligible?

Full-time students in most programs. GAs are allocated by the departments.

### What is the value of a GA?

The current value of a GA is \$5,135.20 for master's students and \$5,723.20 for PhD students for 140 hours of work per semester.

### Other funding opportunities

Research assistantship funding is available in many departments where faculty members hold external research grants. The amount of funding varies from program to program. For further information, contact the relevant program.

Students may also be eligible for research internship funding opportunities through programs such as Connect Canada ([connectcanadainternships.ca](http://connectcanadainternships.ca)) and Mitacs ([mitacs.ca](http://mitacs.ca)).

# PLAN AHEAD!

Early application is recommended in order to be considered for financial support.

A satisfactory score on an English proficiency test is required for applicants whose native language is not English.

The Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and Graduate Management Assessment Test (GMAT) scores are required for certain graduate programs.

Applicants whose academic credentials are difficult to assess may be required to write the GRE.

# LIVING IN WINDSOR

Housing costs in Windsor compare favourably in affordability with the rest of Canada. The average cost to rent a one-bedroom apartment in Windsor is approximately \$650 per month.

The city is located at the extreme southwestern end of Ontario, at the same latitude as northern California.

Country living can be had just a few minutes' drive away from the downtown core and the UWindsor campus.

Area residents enjoy 2,000 acres of parkland, including a riverfront recreational bike/rollerblading trail that begins at the Ambassador Bridge, approximately one block from the UWindsor campus. Located along this trail, the Odette Sculpture Park is a display of large-scale sculptures that stretches for more than five kilometres along the Detroit River.

Close access to the US, via the Ambassador Bridge and the Detroit-Windsor Tunnel, makes Windsor unique in Canada. Detroit, Michigan, is easily accessible and home to world-class museums, art galleries and historical landmarks. For live entertainment, visit Detroit's theatre district or take in major league sports, including pro baseball, basketball, hockey and football.

Transit Windsor offers public bus transportation in the city, and offers service to Detroit, with special shuttles for sporting events.

Windsor is about an hour's drive from Point Pelee National Park, the most southerly mainland point in Canada, popular among recreation- and nature-minded visitors. Go there to see extraordinary migratory birds, monarch butterflies and second-to-none sunsets.

**Master's Admission:** Graduates of recognized universities may be admitted to programs leading to the master's degree. A student with a four-year degree or equivalent in the discipline to which s/he is seeking admission, and who has an academic standing at least in the 70% range in the final two years of study (full-time equivalent) may be admitted to a master's program (M2).

**PhD Admission:** An applicant for admission to a graduate program that leads to the degree of Doctor of Philosophy must normally have a research-based master's degree. In exceptional cases, a four-year bachelor's degree or the equivalent may be accepted. All applicants' academic standing should be unquestionably superior.
