STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

AMOUNT: \$2,000.00

ELIGIBILITY: A student must be enrolled or accepted for enrolment as a full time law student at an accredited University Law School for the academic year 2010-2011. Written confirmation of enrollment or acceptance for enrollment must accompany the student's application with such confirmation coming from the Admissions Office or Office of the Registrar of or for the Accredited Law School. **This written confirmation must accompany the application on the application form.**

METHOD OF SELECTION: A committee selected by the Council of the Law Society of Prince Edward Island shall determine the recipients of the scholarship each year.

CRITERIA:

- 1) The student shall be enrolled in two or more law-related courses at the University;
- 2) The student is ordinarily a resident of Prince Edward Island;
- 3) The student has demonstrated financial need; and
- 4) The student has demonstrated scholastic achievement in the previous year of academic study.

I. **Be it Resolved** that the Regulations of the Law Society of Prince Edward Island made under the authority of the *Legal Profession Act* be amended as follows:

Regulation 11:

11. A person applying to be enrolled and registered as an articled clerk shall:

- (a) be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada;
- (b) except for a person serving articles or clerkship pursuant to the requirements of subsection 17(1),
 - (i) have received a law degree in common law from a Canadian law school;
 - (ii) have successfully completed the following courses in obtaining such Degree:
 - Canadian Constitutional Law
 - Civil Procedure
 - Contracts
 - Criminal Law
 - Property Law
 - Torts
 - Ethics/Professional Responsibility
 - (iii) and have successfully completed 4 of 7 courses in the following subject areas in obtaining such Degree:
 - Criminal Procedure
 - Commercial Law
 - Corporate Law
 - Evidence
 - Family Law
 - Wills/Trusts
 - Administrative Law.

11.1 Notwithstanding sub-section 11(b)(ii) & (iii), Council may, upon application, permit a person who has not successfully completed the said course requirements to enroll and register as an articling clerk subject to any terms Council considers appropriate, if, in the discretion of Council, it is not contrary to the public interest to do so.
