“Copyright Users: Rights without Remedies?”**

This paper highlights the lack if not absence of remedies users have to assert their claims against restrictive uses imposed by copyright holders on copyright works, a void that has been largely overlooked by the copyright literature. It discusses some of the root causes that may explain this important gap in the law and the access to justice issues that the absence of copyright user remedies engenders. The paper maps out what copyright user remedies could look like, while suggesting tools to deal with an ever technological environment that alters how copyright users interact with copyright works. The paper paves the way toward a greater substantiation of the Supreme Court of Canada’s pronouncement in *CCH Canadian Ltd. v Law Society of Upper Canada*, 2004 SCC 13 that: “User rights are not just loopholes. Both owner rights and user rights should therefore be given the fair and balanced reading that befits remedial legislation.” (citing Professor David Vaver).
