In accordance with Section 54-07 of the 2017-2021 Collective Agreement, the Faculty of Nursing invites applications from qualified individuals to teach the following:

**SEPTEMBER – DECEMBER**

<b>COURSE</b>	<b>NURS-1511 – EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING LAB I - TUESDAYS OR THURSDAYS (DAYS/EVENINGS)</b>
<b>OUTLINE</b>	This is the first in a series of seven onsite experiential learning labs in which the learner will apply theory to clinical practice through a variety of interactive and simulated activities. In this course, the learner is introduced to clinical and communication skills for the professional nurse.

<b>COURSE</b>	<b>NURS-2722 – MED OR SURG NURSING – TUES, THURS OR FRI DAYS/AFTERNOONS</b> <b>NURS-2722 – SKILLS LAB – TUESDAYS OR THURSDAYS (DAYS/EVENINGS)</b>
<b>OUTLINE</b>	This is a clinical practice course with emphasis on the continued opportunity to learn and practice professional and technical skills including assessment, goal-oriented planning, interventions and evaluation of clinical outcomes for young adults, adults, and older adults experiencing acute and long term health needs within the context of family and community.

<b>COURSE</b>	<b>NURS-3722 – MON-THURS/SAT. DAYS/AFTERNOONS (COMPLEX, MENTAL HEALTH, COMMUNITY, MED/SURG, OB, PEDS)</b>
<b>OUTLINE</b>	A clinical practice course with emphasis on the practice of professional and technical skills in the care of adults and older adults experiencing complex or multi-system health disruption within the context of family and community.

<b>COURSE</b>	<b>NURS-4722 – HOSPITAL CLINICAL PRECEPTED NURSING EXPERIENCE – MOST WILL RUN IN TWO 6-WK BLOCKS</b>
<b>OUTLINE</b>	A precepted clinical experience, which enables the student to synthesize theory, research, and professional and technical skills, in clinical nursing practice. The expected student outcome is a beginning skill level in the competencies identified by the College of Nurses of Ontario.

<b>COURSE</b>	<b>NURS-4762 – COMMUNITY CLINICAL PRECEPTED NURSING EXPERIENCE</b>
<b>OUTLINE</b>	A precepted clinical experience within the context of community as client which enables the student to synthesize theory, research and professional and technical skills in clinical nursing practice. The expected student outcome is a beginning skill level in the competencies identified by the College of Nurses of Ontario.

**QUALIFICATIONS** Successful applicants will have appropriate academic credentials and teaching competence, as set forth in Article 54:06(a) of the Collective Agreement. BScN degree required; current registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario and entitled to practice with no restrictions; clinical nursing experience in adult health, parent-child health, acute care setting or community nursing according to the setting; teaching experience desirable. **Must be available to teach for the entire term, with no conflicting personal or work commitments.**
