# Master of Nursing (MN)

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The Master in Nursing (MN) program is a **course-based** degree program with specialization/field options: Advanced Clinical Practice Nursing Field, Nursing Leadership Field and Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioner (NP) Field .

## **Essential Academic Requirements for Advanced Clinical Practice and Nursing Leadership Fields (requirements separate for Nurse Practitioner Field)**

- Must have a Bachelor of Science in Nursing or equivalent which includes physical assessment, and courses in research and statistics. Consideration may be given to nurse applicants holding degrees in other cognate disciplines.
- Must have maintained a minimum 70% average in the last two years of their undergraduate program.
- Must be eligible for a current certificate of registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario. ([www.cno.org](http://www.cno.org))

**Program Intake:** Annually each September

**Application Deadline:** February 1st

**Mode of Instruction:** In Class
