

Master of Nursing (MN)

The Master in Nursing (MN) program is a **course-based** degree program with specialization/field options: Advanced Clinical Practice Nursing Field, Nursing Leadership Field and Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioner (NP) Field.

Essential Academic Requirements for Advanced Clinical Practice and Nursing Leadership Fields (requirements separate for Nurse Practitioner Field)

- Must have a Bachelor of Science in Nursing or equivalent which includes physical assessment, and courses in research and statistics. Consideration may be given to nurse applicants holding degrees in other cognate disciplines.
- Must have maintained a minimum 70% average in the last two years of their undergraduate program.
- Must have current registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario with no practice restrictions.

Program Intake: Annually each September

Application Deadline: February 1st

Mode of Instruction: In Class
