The course-based Master of Applied Computing* is a professional program that will provide you with a solid foundation of the industry oriented practical aspects of computer science.

The skills and knowledge that the program offers will allow you the opportunity to develop a successful career in the growing software industry through practical projects, internships and in-class training.

The Master of Applied Computing program has been specifically designed to expose you to the latest technologies and developments in a number of high-demand fields.

You will study and live in Canada for approximately 16 months while enrolled in eight prescribed courses and one Project/Internship course.

Courses will span both the fields of computer science and business to provide you with the tools that you will need to succeed in this growing, global industry.

^{*}The Master of Applied Computing program is a new program offered by the University of Windsor starting in September 2014. Prospective students are advised that offers of admissions to this program will be made only after the Ontario Universities Council on Quality Assurance has approved this program.

Admission Requirements

- Confirmation of a four-year Bachelor in Computer Science or a related discipline from an academic institution approved by the University of Windsor.
- The equivalent of a 70% average or higher in cumulative undergraduate studies or a 77% in the last two years of study (when converted to Ontario standards)
- Demonstrated English proficiency by meeting or exceeding a 6.5 score on the IELTS test or approved equivalent
- A successful interview with a representative of the University of Windsor
- Two letters of reference
- A statement of interest including a description of a major technology project you have undertaken in the past three years.

Applicants with a four-year bachelor degree in other non-CS disciplines will be eligible for admission if they are accepted into and complete the University of Windsor's one-year Bachelor of Computer Science for University Graduates program with a 70% average or better.

English Language Training

You may be conditionally admitted into our program if your English Proficiency test score does not meet our minimum requirement, by taking additional English language training at UWindsor prior to starting your graduate program. If you require English language training, our Centre for English Language Development has a program for you. Courses range from 6-16 weeks, depending on your assessment test.
