A note about professional communication

- We are here to help support you through the application process.
- The expectation is that all correspondence related to the application process or the MSW program is polite and professional.
- Please include your name, student number and program you are applying to (i.e. MSW Advanced Standing On Campus program) in your email correspondence.
- Should any inappropriate, informal, or impolite correspondence sent to the Graduate Secretary will be forwarded to the Coordinator.

MSW – On Campus and MSW-Working Professionals (MSW-WP)

- The University has two different MSW programs. The MSW-On Campus program is a FULL TIME MSW that you can complete in 12-20 months.
- The MSW-WP is offered on the weekends and is administered separately from the on-campus MSW. The MSW-WP takes between 16-32 months to complete.
- When you are applying, in the application portal, make sure you pick the right program!

The application includes the following

- Transcripts (from all institutions, including the University of Windsor).
- Prerequisites (Two Required Courses):
 - One statistics course
 - · One research methods course
- Two Reference Letters
- Personal Statement
- Professional Experience Form (full-time, part-time, relevant work, volunteer, or practica experience, etc.)

The MSW application form for 2024/2025 is currently available.



GPA

- To be considered for admission to the MSW program, the School
 of Social Work requires applicants to have <u>a grade point</u>
 average of 73% or above, calculated based on the last two
 years/ 20 courses of their qualifying Honours degree.
- Applicant must upload <u>ALL</u> transcripts to the application portal.
 This includes all University of Windsor transcripts.
 - Transcripts must have your name, the institution, the degree awarded (or enrolled), the credit weighting and the grade awarded for each class.
 - Unofficial transcripts are accepted for the application
 - Official transcripts need to be submitted after an offer of admission is made.

Statistics and Research Methods Courses

- At the time of application, applicants are required to provide evidence of successful completion of one undergraduate course in statistics and one undergraduate course in research methods.
- If an applicant has not completed one or both of the required courses at the time of application, the applicant must submit a transcript or proof of enrolment in the required course(s), to the School of Social Work prior to <u>March 1st</u>.

Statistics and Research Methods Courses

- The research methods and statistics requirement MUST be satisfied prior to the start of the program.
- A list of pre-approved research and statistics courses is on our website. If your course(s) is not on the list you will need to provide a copy of your course syllabus for approval.

Reference Letters

- The School of Social Work requires two references with your MSW application:
 - 1) Academic Reference
 - 2) Employer Reference from an employer/supervisor who has overseen your work in a paid, volunteer, or a practice/internship or field placement capacity, preferably in the social services
- References from colleagues, peers, friends, and relatives will <u>not</u> be accepted.
- Please make sure to provide your referee with the referee instruction sheet found on our application website (https://www.uwindsor.ca/socialwork/469/msw-admission-application)

References are due by the SSW due date.



Personal Statement

- Please complete an 800-word personal statement that answers specifics about your motivation, experience, and area of interest.
- The instructions for writing this statement are included in the "Personal Statement" section of the application.

Professional Experience

- Please complete the Professional Experience Form outlining your work, volunteer, and practica/internship experiences;
- Publications, thesis, other professional activities where you were the presenter or author;
- Any professional associations, training sessions, or workshops you attended.

Deadlines

MSW -

- One-Year Advanced Standing MSW Program for May 2025 admission – November 15th 2024
- Two-Year Regular-Track MSW Program for September
 2025 admission January 15th 2025

MSW/JD -

- Faculty of Law November 1st, 2023
- School of Social Work January 15th 2024

Application Portal

- The University of Windsor will be moving over from the current application portal, Electronic Graduate Application System (eGAS), to UWinsite Student. This change is projected to take place in early May 2024.
- The School of Social Work will update our Admissions Website (https://www.uwindsor.ca/socialwork/469/msw-admission-application) to advise when the UWinsite Student portal opens.
- The Faculty of Graduate Studies' website, Graduate Application Steps (https://www.uwindsor.ca/graduate-studies/354/apply) will be updated on how to apply via UWinsite Student.
- You are responsible to make sure all required documents are included in your application
