

NOTICE: GRADUATE ASSISTANT (GA) POSITIONS AVAILABLE FOR WINTER 2018

In accordance with Article 12:01 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement the **School of Social Work** invites applications for GA positions for the **Winter 2018** term (January 1 to April 30, 2018). It has been anticipated that 20 positions of 140 hours each and 4 positions of 70 hours will be required for Winter 2018 term, although these numbers are subject to sufficient enrolment and final budgetary approval.

Eligibility requirements:

GA appointments shall be offered in accordance with the criteria specified in Article 12:03 of the Collective Agreement. In addition, preference will be given to applicants who demonstrate expertise in social work course material and development, and web design.

The GA Collective Agreement indicates that once offered a term of GA-ship, Master students must be offered a minimum of two subsequent GA assignments to a total of 420 hours, and PhD students, six subsequent assignments to a total of 980 hours (Article 13:01). Further, Doctoral students are given priority over Master students per one of the criteria set out in article 12:03. Therefore, assignment will be prioritized as follows:

- Previous GA commitments that could not be filled in a subsequent term
- Existing GA commitments
- PhD Students
- Master students

A student must be registered full time and be in good standing in order to hold a Graduate Assistantship. A full graduate assistantship requires an average of 10 hours per week for a maximum of 140 hours per semester. Refer to Articles 12, 13, and 14 of the Collective Agreement for eligibility details.

Please see the list of positions available below. Note that all positions for new GA's are for 140 hours for the term (10 hours a week on average). Where 70-hr half-positions are listed (0.5 GAs) they will be combined with another 70-hr half-position for a full 140-hr GA position.

Note that Graduate Assistants must apply each term by the application deadline, in accordance with Article 13:

"With respect to those students who have applied for and been accepted for Assistantships, the Assistant will not be paid for any shortfall of hours at the end of their respective program, provided the University has satisfied its obligation to post available positions each term in writing and on the AAU website and to offer the minimum terms of support in accordance with Article 13:01 (a) & (b) and provided that the Assistant has applied in writing or via e-mail by the application deadline for each term until they have received the minimum terms of support in accordance with Article 13:01 (a) & (b)."
