ADSE Dr. Godfrey Bachevie Diaspora Scholarship

The income from this fund will be used to provide support to one or more qualified undergraduate students in Year 2 to 4 in any Faculty and any program. Awarded to students of black African descent in recognition of the unique educational circumstances and scholarship needs of members of their communities. Eligible candidates must maintain a good academic average (minimum cumulative average of 72%), must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements, who demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to Diaspora Conference participants. ADSE Micheline Rawlins

The income from this fund will be used to provide support to one or more qualified undergraduate students in any Faculty and any year of study. Cecil Houston Diaspora Scholarship Fund

The income from this fund will provide a number of awards to selected first year students. Consideration is given to students of black African descent in recognition of the unique educational circumstances and scholarship needs of members of their communities. Eligible candidates must have a minimum entering average of 70%, must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements, who demonstrate financial need. If you wish to be considered for this award, please apply to the general application "Awards for African Diaspora Students with Financial Need" by October 15.

Diaspora Admission Scholarship

Dr. Kenneth Montague African Diaspora Scholarship

The Dr. Kenneth Montague African Diaspora Scholarship is awarded annually to a student of black descent in recognition of the unique educational needs of members of their communities. Based on academic merit (minimum cumulative average of 75%) and financial need. Applicants must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents, who meet Ontario residency requirements. Larry Stout Endowed Scholarship

Awarded annually to a Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences student in Year 3 or 4, the Larry Stout Endowed Scholarship is awarded to a student of black African descent in recognition of the unique educational needs of members of their communities. Applicants must have demonstrated active involvement and leadership in University campus activities, groups, clubs, etc. Based on academic standing and financial need. Applicants must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), who meet OSAP Ontario residency requirements. If you wish to be considered for this award, please apply to the general application "Awards for African Diaspora Students with Financial Need" by October 15.

Lawrence and Judith Tanenbaum Family Foundation Award

The income from this fund will provide one award annually to a first year undergraduate student in any Faculty. Awarded to students of black African descent in recognition of the unique educational circumstances and scholarship needs of members of their communities. Eligible candidates must have a minimum entering average of 70%, must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements, who demonstrate financial need. If you wish to be considered for this award please apply to the general application "Awards for African Diaspora Students with Financial Need" by October 15.

The Charles and Mary Kamen Scholarship

Interest from this trust will support an annual award to a student of Black African descent in recognition of the unique educational circumstances and scholarship needs of members of their communities. Applications are accepted from full time undergraduate and graduate students in any year of study in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences. Based on academic merit (minimum entering average of 75% or in course minimum cumulative average of 73%). Apply online.

The Spratt African Diaspora Leadership Award

Up to four awards will be available annually to full time undergraduate students of the African Diaspora entering full time study in any faculty or program, directly from high school or as a transfer student. Based on academic standing, financial need and leadership potential. Applicants must have demonstrated leadership potential as reflected in an industrious record at high school and/ or community engagement. A letter of support/corroboation from the High School (teacher, principal or guidance counsellor) and/or community member must accompany the application. Award is renewable in subsequent years provided eligibility criteria are maintained. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) in Ontario who meet Ontario Student Assistance Program Ontario residency requirements. Award recipients are required to participate in a Faculty/Student mentorship program and Financial Planning Workshop. Apply online. Deadline: December 15.
