



AWARDS FOR STUDENTS IN THE FACULTY OF ARTS, HUMANITIES, AND SOCIAL SCIENCES - 2017/18

COMMUNICATION, MEDIA & FILM

Kenneth and Rose Van Meer Memorial Entrance Scholarship

This award is available to a gay male student registered full time in Year 1 of the Honours Computer Science, Honours Communication Studies, or a Faculty of Science Honours program, with preference given to a Computer Science student. Based on good academic performance (minimum 80% cumulative average required) and demonstrated financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who meet OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Preference will be given to a resident of Windsor or Essex County who has graduated from a Windsor or Essex County secondary school. Award is renewable in subsequent years, provided qualifying conditions are maintained. Apply online.

Kenneth J. Van Meer Scholarship

This award is available to gay male students registered full time in Year 2, 3, or 4 in the Honours Computer Science, Honours Communication Studies or a Faculty of Science Honours program with preference given to Computer Science students. Based on good academic performance (minimum cumulative average of 76% required) and demonstrated financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Preference will be given to residents of Windsor or Essex County who have graduated from Windsor or Essex County secondary schools. Award is renewable through re application in subsequent years provided qualifying conditions are maintained. Award cannot be held concurrently with the Kenneth and Rose Van Meer Memorial Entrance Scholarship. Apply on line.

Lawson Family Award in Arts and Social Science

One award given annually to a 3rd or 4th year student registered full time in Drama, Visual Arts or Communication, Media and Film. Based on academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 75% required) and proven financial need. Candidates must demonstrate active involvement and leadership in University campus activities (UWSA, campus groups, clubs, etc.) and/or community groups and activities in Windsor Essex County. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Apply on line.

Martha & Werner Hildebrandt Award

Awarded to a Year 2, 3 or 4 full time Communication Studies student. Preference will be given to a Communication Studies student going on an exchange. Based on good academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 72%), and proven financial need. The successful candidate must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status), who meets Ontario residency requirements. Apply on line.

Media Street Productions Scholarship

Awarded annually to students registered full time in Year 2, 3 or 4 in Visual Arts or Communication Studies. Based on good academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 78% required), citizenship, and proven financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), who meet Ontario residency requirements. If you have applied for the University of Windsor In Course Bursary by October 15 through this awards search you will automatically be considered for this award.

Rotary Club of Windsor Communication Studies Award

Awarded annually to a resident of Essex County, enrolled in Year 3 or 4 of the Communication, Media and Film program on the basis of academic achievement (minimum cumulative average of 75%) and financial need. Preference will be given to applicants intending to pursue a career in journalism. Established in 1991 by the Rotary Club of Windsor on behalf of President Fred Sorrell, and in memory of Angus Munro, a well known newspaper reporter and writer. Apply on line.

DRAMATIC ARTS

Backstage Award

Two awards given to Year 1 students registered full time in the School of Creative Arts/Music or the School of Dramatic Art for outstanding creative work in his/her final secondary school year. Creative work is considered to be the writing of plays, scores, lyrics, set design, underscoring, and work with lighting and sound. Performance students may be considered as well, provided that they also assisted backstage. Eligible candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), who meet the Ontario Student Assistance Program Ontario residency requirements, and who are facing proven financial hardship. Recipients must be in good academic standing. This award was established in 2004 in memory of Ethel May and Rowland Marshall. Apply on line.

Claire Kire Memorial Bursary

Value: \$150. Awarded annually on the basis of academic merit (minimum cumulative average of 66%) and financial need, to a second or third year student in Dramatic Art. If you have applied for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

Club Soda Award of Excellence

Interest from this fund will provide an annual award to a Year 3 or 4 Dramatic Art student. Award is based on academic performance (minimum cumulative average of 75%), financial need, proven leadership, voluntary participation in a community theatre production, community drama project or workshop, or a University Players production. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Club Soda members are not eligible to receive this award unless their current term is over. Apply on line.

Follow Your Dreams Award

The Follow Your Dreams Award was established to recognize a student working toward a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Acting who strives for excellence in his/her program. Interest from the trust will support a student in Year 3 or 4 with demonstrated financial need. Candidates must be

Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) in Ontario who meet Ontario Student Assistance Program residency requirements. Apply online.

Frances Elder Undergraduate Scholarship

Interest from this fund will support one award for a Dramatic Art student in Years 2 through 4 . Based on a minimum cumulative average of 76% and financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Preference will be given to a student who has graduated from a Windsor/Essex County Secondary School. If you have applied for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15 through the awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

Francis & Vera McGrath Dramatic Art Bursary

Interest from this trust will support an annual award for a full time undergraduate Dramatic Art student. Based on good academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 70%) and financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who meet OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Award may be renewed if eligibility criteria met. Previous recipients must re apply each year. To be considered for this award you must apply for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15.

Jules Tonus Memorial Endowment Scholarship for Excellence in Theatre Design and Practice

Awarded to a full time third year undergraduate student registered in Honours Dramatic Art, who has successfully completed a minimum of four courses in Scenic Design, Costume Design, Lighting Design, Stage Makeup or Scene Painting and has indicated an interest in pursuing a career in technical theatre and/or design. Based on good academic performance (minimum cumulative average of 75%), financial need, returning for Fourth Year. Candidate must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Person status) who meets the Ontario Student Assistance Program Ontario residency requirements. Apply online.

Lawson Family Award in Arts and Social Science

One award given annually to a 3rd or 4th year student registered full time in Drama, Visual Arts or Communication, Media and Film. Based on academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 75% required) and proven financial need. Candidates must demonstrate active involvement and leadership in University campus activities (UWSA, campus groups, clubs, etc.) and/or community groups and activities in Windsor Essex County. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Apply on line.

Meharry Drama in Education Bursary

Interest from this fund will support one bursary annually for a student in Year 1 of the Drama in Education Program with financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. To be considered for this award, you must apply for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15.

ENGLISH

Alistair & Anita MacLeod Prize in Creative Writing

Awarded annually to a full time student registered in the Department of English, chosen through a competition of the best fiction as judged by a departmental committee. The candidate must have a minimum cumulative average of 78%, and must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident, who meets Ontario residency requirements, and has proven financial need. Apply on line and provide a piece of fiction between 1000 3000 words.

Dr. Eugene McNamara Scholarship

Interest from this trust will support one award for a full time undergraduate student in Year 3 or 4 in the Department of English, Creative Writing Program. Based on academic achievement (minimum cumulative average of 78%) and financial need. Applicants must submit a one page recent example of their creative writing in any genre. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Apply online.

H & E Scholarship for Excellence in English

The income of this fund will be used to provide bursary support to a full time undergraduate student registered in years 2, 3, or 4 in the Department of English, who demonstrates financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who meet Ontario Student Assistance Program Ontario residency requirements. If you have applied for a "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

John Christopher Beer Bursaries in English

Up to 3 bursaries awarded annually to full time undergraduate students registered in the English program who have demonstrated financial need. Recipients must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements and be in good academic standing. If you have applied for a "University of Windsor In course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

Sean Ganley Memorial Award in Irish Studies

Awarded to a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status) residing in Ontario who has demonstrated financial need. The successful candidate must have the highest final grade among those who apply in a course (in any semester) that is predominantly devoted to Irish literature, history or culture. The course must be offered by one of the following departments: English, History, Classical and Modern Languages. Preference given to undergraduate students. Apply on line.

HISTORY

David P. Botsford Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to a student registered in Level 4 Honours History who has a superior academic record and has demonstrated an interest in local area studies. The awardee will be expected to prepare an original research paper under the direction of the Department of History, and to present this paper publicly at the request of the David P. Botsford Memorial Committee. Established in 1979 in memory of David P. Botsford, C.M., in recognition of his lifelong service to area historical studies. Details available from the Department of History.

Dr. Milorad Vuckovic Memorial Scholarship

One or more scholarships to deserving students in the field of History, in Year 2 or beyond, assigned on the basis of academic merit and financial need. Established in 1975 by friends in memory of Dr. Vuckovic, long time Head of the History Department. If you have applied for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

Sean Ganley Memorial Award in Irish Studies

Awarded to a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status) residing in Ontario who has demonstrated financial need. The successful candidate must have the highest final grade among those who apply in a course (in any semester) that is predominantly devoted to Irish literature, history or culture. The course must be offered by one of the following departments: English, History, Classical and Modern Languages. Preference given to undergraduate students. Apply on line.

LANGUAGES, LITERATURE & CULTURE

Anita W. and Arthur Wendt Award in German

Awarded to a German Major student returning for Year 3 or 4, with the highest major average in German program courses (minimum 3 German language program courses) who demonstrates financial need. Preference given to a student registered in the Ontario Baden Wurtemberg Exchange Program. Successful candidate must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status), who meets Ontario residency requirements. Established in 2003 in honour of Anita W. and Arthur Wendt by Susan Wendt Hildebrandt. Apply on line.

Mrs. Whistle French Scholarship

Awards will be allocated annually to full time students in the French program participating in exchange programs. The awards are based on good academic standing (minimum major average of 75%) and financial need. Successful candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Apply on line. Fall deadline: July 15; Winter deadline: November 15.

Sean Ganley Memorial Award in Irish Studies

Awarded to a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status) residing in Ontario who has demonstrated financial need. The successful candidate must

have the highest final grade among those who apply in a course (in any semester) that is predominantly devoted to Irish literature, history or culture. The course must be offered by one of the following departments: English, History, Classical and Modern Languages. Preference given to undergraduate students. Apply on line.

MUSIC

Backstage Award

Two awards given to Year 1 students registered full time in the School of Creative Arts/Music or the School of Dramatic Art for outstanding creative work in his/her final secondary school year. Creative work is considered to be the writing of plays, scores, lyrics, set design, underscoring, and work with lighting and sound. Performance students may be considered as well, provided that they also assisted backstage. Eligible candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), who meet the Ontario Student Assistance Program Ontario residency requirements, and who are facing proven financial hardship. Recipients must be in good academic standing. This award was established in 2004 in memory of Ethel May and Rowland Marshall. Apply on line.

Camello Doctor Family Music Heritage Bursary

Two awards will be available annually. Applicants must be full time undergraduate students entering Year 1 of the Music program. Based on academic merit (minimum 70% admission average required) and financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) in Ontario who meet Ontario Student Assistance Program Ontario residency requirements. Apply on line.

Clyde Long/Windsor Community Choir

An annual award to a Year 3 or 4 Voice/Music student who is a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP residency requirements. Based on good academic standing and demonstrated financial need. Established in 1999 by the Windsor Community Choir to honour the memory of Clyde Long. If you have applied for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

David Palmer Scholarship

Awarded to a full time undergraduate student registered in the School of Music, based on academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 80% required) and financial need. Candidates must be Canadian citizens or Permanent residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. To be considered for this award you must apply for the 'University of Windsor In Course Bursary' by October 15.

Louise Victoria Scholarship for Voice

Interest from this trust will support one award annually (up to \$1000) for a student registered in second year or beyond in the School of Music. Based on academic merit (minimum cumulative average of 75% required) and demonstrated financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) in Ontario who meet Ontario Student Assistance Program Ontario residency requirements. If you have applied for a "University of Windsor In course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

Percy Beneteau Memorial Bursary

An annual award for a Year 2 or above Music major. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative average of 72% and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to students who demonstrate outstanding performance ability. Students must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Person status), satisfying OSAP residency rules. Participation in volunteer community activities may also be a consideration. Established in 1996 by the Windsor Downtown Lions Club in memory of Mr. Beneteau. Apply on line.

Raymond E. Bowyer School of Music Scholarship

Awarded to a full time undergraduate student registered in the School of Music on the basis of good academic performance (minimum cumulative average of 70%) and proven financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. If you have applied for the University of Windsor In Course Bursary by October 15 through this awards search you will automatically be considered for this award.

PHILOSOPHY

Philosophy Alumni Undergraduate Bursary

Awarded to a deserving undergraduate student majoring in philosophy who demonstrates financial need and academic potential. Minimum cumulative average of 73% required. If you have applied for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

POLITICAL SCIENCE

David Wurfel Scholarship in Political Science

The David Wurfel Scholarship in Political Science is awarded annually to an outstanding, full time, third or fourth year Political Science student. Preference will be given to a student enrolled in the International Relations and Development Studies programme. Based on academic performance (minimum cumulative average of 80%) and proven financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) residing in Ontario. If you have applied for the University of Windsor In Course Bursary by October 15 through this awards search you will automatically be considered for this award.

Howard Pawley Entrance Award in Political Science

Awarded annually to a student who intends to major in Political Science; International Relations Students may apply for this award as well. The award is granted based on academic merit and financial need, and may be combined with other awards. To be considered for this award, you must apply for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15.

Kiervin Family Award

Awarded to a full time undergraduate Political Science student in Year 2, 3 or 4 whose studies have an international focus. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who meet OSAP Ontario residency requirements

and have demonstrated financial need. To be considered for this award, you must apply for the University of Windsor In Course Bursary by October 15.

Martha Lee Scholarship for Political Science

One award granted annually to a full time undergraduate Political Science student in Year 2. Based on academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 85% required). Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status). The qualified applicant with the highest cumulative average will be awarded the scholarship. Apply online.

Michael Drago Memorial Award

Awarded annually to students registered full-time in the Faculty of Arts & Social Science in the International Relations & Development or Political Science programs. Based on good academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 75%) and citizenship. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who reside in Ontario, with proven financial need. Apply on-line.

Ronald Wagenberg Entrance Scholarship in Political Science

Awarded annually to an outstanding secondary school student entering the Political Science program. A minimum 80% admission average required. Established in 1996 by the Faculty of Political Science. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who meet Ontario Student Assistance Program Ontario residence requirements and demonstrate financial need. To be considered for this award, you must apply for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15.

Rudolf A. Helling Memorial Award

Awarded annually to an outstanding student (minimum cumulative average of 75%) entering Year 3 or 4 of an Honours program in Sociology, Anthropology, Political Science or Geography, who is pursuing studies in race, ethnic, or intergroup relations as they relate to Canada's heritage. Established in 1983 in memory of Dr. Rudolf Helling, founding Chairman of the Sociology Department and Professor of Sociology. Apply on line.

Walter C. Soderlund Award in Political Science

Awarded annually to an outstanding student in second, third, or fourth year Political Science, who has maintained a minimum cumulative average of 80%, and has proven financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons stats) and reside in Ontario. To be considered for this award you must apply for the "University of Windsor In Course Bursary" by October 15.

Douglas Davies Memorial Bursary

Awarded annually to a student with financial need who is registered in a certificate or degree program in Criminology. If you have applied for a "University of Windsor In course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

Dr. Robert Whitehurst Undergraduate Scholarship

Interest from this trust will support an award to a third or fourth year undergraduate Sociology student. Based on academic achievement (minimum cumulative average of 80%), excellent citizenship (activities for the department, university and/or community), and financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. *Note: The scholarship may not be awarded every year. Apply on line.

Gordon David Baillargeon Memorial Scholarship

Awarded annually to a 3rd or 4th year student registered full time in Psychology or Social Work. A minimum cumulative average of 78% and demonstrated financial need is required. The recipient must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Established in memory of Gordon Baillargeon who graduated with a major in Psychology and who later returned as a part time student taking courses in Social Work. If you have applied for a "University of Windsor In course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

Graybiel In-Course Scholarships

Up to ten scholarships of \$1000 each awarded annually to second, third, or fourth year Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who are graduates of Windsor secondary schools. Preference given to students majoring in English, History, French, Modern Languages, Social Sciences and Applied Sciences. Minimum cumulative average of 75% required. Financial need will be a consideration. Established in 1997 by the Graybiel family. Apply on line.

Joannie Cowie Canada Cares Foundation Bursary

One bursary valued at \$250 is available for a year 2, 3 or 4 student with a neuro muscular disorder in the Sociology or Criminology program. Candidates must also be in good academic standing and demonstrate financial need. This bursary was established in 2001 by the Joannie Cowie Canada Cares Foundation. Apply on line.

Rudolf A. Helling Memorial Award

Awarded annually to an outstanding student (minimum cumulative average of 75%) entering Year 3 or 4 of an Honours program in Sociology, Anthropology, Political Science or Geography, who is pursuing studies in race, ethnic, or intergroup relations as they relate to Canada's heritage. Established in 1983 in memory of Dr. Rudolf Helling, founding Chairman of the Sociology Department and Professor of Sociology. Apply on line.

VISUAL ARTS

Lawson Family Award in Arts and Social Science

One award given annually to a 3rd or 4th year student registered full time in Drama, Visual Arts or Communication, Media and Film. Based on academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 75% required) and proven financial need. Candidates must demonstrate active involvement and leadership in University campus activities (UWSA, campus groups, clubs, etc.) and/or community groups and activities in Windsor Essex County. Candidates must be Canadian

Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Apply on line.

Marica Janisse Bursary

Awarded annually to a Visual Arts student in Year 2, 3, or 4. The student must have a minimum cumulative average of 72% and demonstrate financial need. Established in 1998 by Marica Janisse. If you have applied for the University of Windsor In Course Bursary by October 15 through this awards search you will automatically be considered for this award.

Nodder Hayes Visual Arts Scholarship

Awarded annually to a full time undergraduate first year student in the Visual or Fine Arts Program. Candidates must be a Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status). Financial need may be a consideration. To be considered, applicants for this award must submit a short essay explaining why the visual arts are a critical facet of a better society. Submissions will be adjudicated by a committee from the School of Creative Art. Apply online.

Peter K. Ryan Scholarship

An annual award of \$1600 for a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status) residing in Ontario, studying in Level 3 or 4 of the Visual Arts program. A minimum cumulative average of 76% and demonstrated financial need is required. Established in 1998 in memory of Peter K. Ryan. If you have applied for the University of Windsor In Course Bursary by October 15 through this awards search you will automatically be considered for this award.

University of Windsor Undergraduate Environmental Scholarship

Awarded annually on the basis of merit to a senior undergraduate student in an environmental program at the University of Windsor who intends to pursue further environmental studies. Areas of Study include: Biological Sciences, Chemistry and Biochemistry, Civil and Environmental Engineering, Earth Sciences, Environmental Science, Environmental Studies or Visual Arts (Green Corridor included). Based on academic achievement (minimum cumulative average of 83%), proven financial need and citizenship. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who meet OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Apply on line.

GENERAL FAHSS AWARDS

Cecile (Robinet) & Lionel Lacoursiere Scholarship

Value: up to \$2500. Awarded to a full time, undergraduate student registered in Biology or Arts & Social Science (excluding Visual Arts, Drama & Music), based on good academic standing (minimum 75% cumulative average) and demonstrated financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Person status) who meet OSAP Ontario residency requirements. If you have applied for a "University of Windsor In course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

David and Ann Biggar Scholarship

Interest from this fund will support one award to a part time undergraduate student in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences (FASS). Based on a minimum cumulative average of 75% and financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), meeting OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Apply on line.

Dr. David H. Hubel Scholarship

Awarded annually to a first year student registered full time in the Faculty of Science or Social Science, on the basis of scholastic standing (minimum cumulative average of 80%) and financial need. Applicants are required to submit a brief outline of "Ideas for the Science Society" (see details in on line application). Candidates must meet OSOTF requirements Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), residing in Ontario. Established in 2004 by the Science Society, in honour of Nobel Laureate Dr. David H. Hubel. Apply on line.

Faculty of Arts Memorial Awards

One or more awards for deserving students enrolled in any degree program in Arts, awarded on the basis of academic standing and/or financial need. Established in 1981 in memory of Rev. E.R. Malley, C.S.B., former Dean of the Faculty of Arts. If you have applied for a "University of Windsor In course Bursary" by October 15 through this awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

Graybiel In-Course Scholarships

Up to ten scholarships of \$1000 each awarded annually to second, third, or fourth year Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who are graduates of Windsor secondary schools. Preference given to students majoring in English, History, French, Modern Languages, Social Sciences and Applied Sciences. Minimum cumulative average of 75% required. Financial need will be a consideration. Established in 1997 by the Graybiel family. Apply on line.

Homer Plante Clifford Peters Roy Lacoursiere Scholarship

Value: up to \$2500. Awarded to a full time, undergraduate student registered in Biology or Arts & Social Science (excluding Visual Arts, Drama & Music). Based on good academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 75% required) and demonstrated financial need. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who meet OSAP Ontario residency requirements. If you have applied for a "University of Windsor In course Bursary" by October 15 through the awards search, you will automatically be considered for this award.

Joe Mattson Memorial Award

Awarded annually to a student entering Year 2 or beyond in the Faculty of Arts or Social Sciences. Assigned on the basis of financial need and community involvement. Preference will be given to students involved with CJAM Radio. Established in 1994 by family and friends of Mr. Mattson to honour his memory. Apply on line.

Joseph T. Culliton Award in the Humanities

This award is to honour the memory of Rev. Dr. Joseph T. Culliton, former Dean of Arts, Professor of Religious Studies, and staunch advocate of the humanities during his long career.

An award will be made annually to a full time student in third or fourth year who is pursuing a major or joint major in Classics, English, History, a Modern Language, Philosophy, Music, Dramatic Art or Visual Arts. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative average of 76% and demonstrate financial need. Applications must include an essay (1000 words) discussing the importance of the humanities and a liberal arts education in our changing world (submit to Student Awards & Financial Aid Office, clearly identified for this award). Larry Stout Endowed Scholarship

Awarded annually to a Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences student in Year 3 or 4, the Larry Stout Endowed Scholarship is awarded to a student of black African descent in recognition of the unique educational needs of members of their communities. Applicants must have demonstrated active involvement and leadership in University campus activities, groups, clubs, etc. Based on academic standing and financial need. Applicants must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status), who meet OSAP Ontario residency requirements. Michael Drago Memorial Award

Awarded annually to students registered full-time in the Faculty of Arts & Social Science in the International Relations & Development or Political Science programs. Based on good academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 75%) and citizenship. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) who reside in Ontario, with proven financial need. Apply on-line.

Peter W. Halford Award in the Humanities

Awarded to a full time, Year 2, 3 or 4 student, with a major or joint major in History, English, Philosophy, French, Classics, or a Modern Language, who is maintaining a minimum cumulative average of 76%. The eligible candidate must be someone who has returned to full time studies after having been away from school for at least two years. This award is to honour the memory of Dr. Peter Halford (1941 2002), former professor and counselor in the Department of French, who studied the lexicon and history of the French of Le Detroit. Shaughnessy Cohen Memorial Scholarship

Available to a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status) student residing in Ontario who is entering a program in the Faculty of Arts or Social Science directly from an Ontario High School. Students must have a minimum scholarship average of 85%, and demonstrate financial need. Candidates must submit a 250 word essay which explains how their chosen program of study will benefit the public interest. The Charles and Mary Kamen Scholarship

Interest from this trust will support an annual award to a student of Black African descent in recognition of the unique educational circumstances and scholarship needs of members of their communities.
