AWARDS FOR STUDENTS OF INDIGENOUS DESCENT - 2017/18

Chippewas of Rama First Nations/McCarthy Tetreault LLP Aboriginal Scholarship

Interest from this trust will be awarded to an Aboriginal Law student based on financial need, academic excellence and commitment to the Aboriginal community. Applicants must also submit "Letters of Support" documenting their involvement in the Aboriginal Community. The scholarship was established in 2002. Apply on line.

Geoffrey H. Wood Native Bursary

Candidates must be of Aboriginal ancestry (status, non status, Metis, Bill C31, Innu and Inuit), maintain satisfactory academic standing and demonstrate financial need. Apply on line.

Indigenous Postsecondary Education and Training Bursary

The Government of Ontario has created a bursary fund for students of Indigenous ancestry (Non status, Metis, Bill C 31, Status, Innu, Inuit). Eligible candidates must be able to demonstrate financial need and provide documented sources of support. Candidates must also be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents (includes those with Protected Persons status) residing in Ontario. Apply on line. Deadline: October 15.

Leroy Freeman Altman Memorial Award

One or more bursaries awarded annually on the basis of academic merit and financial need to students in a program of studies concerned with or of direct benefit to the Aboriginal community in Canada. Established in 1983 in memory of Leroy Freeman Altman, member of Walpole Island Indian Band. Apply on line.

Marie M. (Chauvin) Tizzard Memorial Bursary

One award granted annually to a full time undergraduate Social Work student. Based on academic standing (minimum cumulative average of 70% required) and financial need. The bursary may be renewable in subsequent years provided the recipient continues to meet the eligibility criteria. Previous recipients must reapply for consideration. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens or Permanent Residents of Indigenous ancestry (status, non status, Metis, Bill C31, Innu and Inuit). The bursary was established through a generous gift from the Estate of Marie M. (Chauvin) Tizzard. Mrs. Tizzard was a UWindsor Alumna and Social Worker who wanted to help Canadian Aboriginal students with financial need to pursue a university degree in Social Work. Apply online.

Stuart H. Surlin Bursary for Aboriginal Students

In recognition of Dr. Surlin's interests in Aboriginal culture and values, a bursary fund has been established in his name to assist in course Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident (includes those with Protected Persons status) students of Aboriginal ancestry residing in Ontario in completing their studies at the University of Windsor. Bursary awards in varying amounts will be awarded to Aboriginal students according to financial need. A minimum cumulative average of 65% is required. Apply on line.
