By combining social work courses with courses in disability studies, psychology, sociology, women's and gender studies, and other disciplines, our program will prepare you for professional registration in the Ontario College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers and elsewhere.

It is also available as a two-year (20-course) degree completion program to applicants who have graduated from a general and honour's BA in a social science discipline, or from an Ontario Child and Youth Worker Diploma program.

Social work engages with individuals, families, communities and societies to improve the quality of life. It is a growing and challenging profession with many opportunities for personal and professional development.
