# Appendix A: Principles of Ignite Student Job Design

Ensuring student roles are educational, supportive, and appropriate within the institutional framework.

## 1. Keep Job Titles Student-Centric

Clearly identify that the position is designed for a student by naming the title accordingly.

✓ Use titles that reflect the supportive nature of the role, such as:
 ✓ Peer Support
 ✓ Program Helper
 ✓ Outreach Assistant
 ✓ Student Ambassador
 ✗ Avoid titles commonly associated with permanent staff positions, such as:
 ✗ Coordinator
 ✗ Administrative Assistant
 ✗ Secretary
 ✗ Technician

## 2. Emphasize Supportive Contributions in the Job Description:

Frame the student's work as assisting, supporting, or complementing core functions of existing staff.

✓ Use phrasing like:
 ✓ "Assists with program logistics"
 ✓ "Supports events under supervision"
 ✗ "Responsible for office operations"
 ✗ "Manages communications strategy"

#### 3. Define Scope and Supervision:

Student roles should have a clear, limited scope and include staff oversight.

✓ Outline that student positions:
 ✓ Operate under the guidance of a staff or faculty member
 ✓ Focus on clear, task-based duties (e.g. "helping set up events")
 ✓ Rather than:
 ✓ Operating independently with decision-making authority
 ✓ Focusing on broad responsibilities (e.g. "managing operations")

### 4. Assign Roles That Complement (Not Duplicate)

Student roles enhance the work of existing staff, rather than replacing or mirroring responsibilities.

✓ Student positions should be:

✓ Additive to the team, helping with projects, events, peer engagement, or other tasks

× Rather than:

× Fulfilling ongoing institutional needs that mirror administrative, technical, or academic staff role

#### 5. Highlight Learning and Skill Development

Center the experience around student growth to distinguish roles as educational opportunities.

✓ Focus on opportunities for students to:	× Rather than:
