- (a) ten courses, including CMAF-1010, FILM-1100, CMAF-2340, CMAF-2750, plus one of CMAF-2010, CMAF-2250, CMAF-3340 or CMAF-3750, plus five additional CMAF or FILM courses, at least two of which must be at the 3000 level or above (excluding CMAF-3990);
- (b) ENGL-1010 (students with 80% or higher in Grade 12 ENG4U (or equivalent) are exempt from this course requirement and will substitute it with an additional course from any area of study.)
- (c) one course with Indigenous content, perspectives, or materials (see Office of the Dean of the Faculty of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences for complete list.)
- (d) two courses from Arts;
- (e) two courses from Languages or Science;
- (f) two courses from any area of study, excluding Social Sciences;
- (g) six courses from any area of study, including CMAF and FILM;
- (h) six courses from any area of study, excluding CMAF and FILM.

Total courses: thirty.
