Qualifications

- Must have a background in Music, preferably in Music-Vocal.
- Preference will be given to instructors who are certified members in good standing with the Ontario College of Teachers and who hold a Bachelor of Education degree.
- Appropriate educational qualifications as evidenced by a relevant Ph.D., Master's Degree, or terminal degree and/or equivalent professional qualifications.
- A Graduate and/or terminal degree in the subject area is preferred.
- 5+ years of relevant experience.
- Experience in the teaching field and/or division.
- Applicants should possess a proven track record of excellence in teaching within an established professional development program. This would be evidenced by one or more of the following:
 - 1) Course evaluations from credit and non-credit courses
 - 2) Qualitative student assessments
 - 3) Client testimonials
- Applicants should have appropriate subject-matter expertise. This may be evidenced by one or more of the following:
 - 1) Publications (peer-reviewed publications, refereed journals, textbooks)
 - 2) Work experience
 - 3) Consulting experiences
- Experience with instructing using the Brightspace Learning Management System or other learning platforms is preferred.

Interested applicants must provide:

1. A cover letter or statement of interest in teaching that specifies the course(s) you wish to be considered for. This statement should detail how you meet the stated qualifications.
2. A copy of your CV. Note: Instructors who have previously taught the course for which they are applying must include their most recent CV.
3. Applicants may also add to their application with qualitative student assessments and/or client testimonials.
