FALL 2025 and Winter 2026

In accordance with Article 12:01 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement the Faculty of Education invites applications for GA positions for Fall 2025 and Winter 2026 semesters.

The total number of projected Graduate Assistantship positions for Fall 2025 is 22 GAs and Winter 2026 is 16 GAs for a total of 5040 hours. All positions are subject to sufficient enrolment and final budgetary approval.

Expected GA duties:

Projected duties are in accordance with article 14:03.

Assistants cannot commence their GA/TA duties until email confirmation of the approval of their contract is received from Human Resources (email titled “Authorization to Commence GA/TA Duties”).

GA employees are expected to make themselves available to report for all assigned duties, **both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties**. Most classes across the University are held face-to-face on campus and even online classes may require on-campus face-to-face duties.

Eligibility requirements:

Successful applicants must be available to attend at the specified time of the course/lab/exams and to report for all assigned duties, which may include both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties.

GA appointments will be offered to qualified applicants in accordance with the criteria specified in Article 12:03 of the CUPE4580 Collective Agreement.

To be eligible for a Graduate Assistantship you must be a **registered fulltime graduate student**:

- must be registered for the term of work at the time of hiring
- must maintain **fulltime** registration throughout the term and must be in good standing in the degree program
- Must be legally eligible to work in Canada with a valid social insurance number and valid study permit

GA appointments cannot exceed **140 hours total for the Fall 2025 term period (Sept. 1st to Dec. 31st) or the Winter 2026 term period (Jan. 1st to Apr. 30th)**. Refer to Articles 12, 13, and 14 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement for eligibility details.

Required essential qualifications: Successful applicants must meet all essential qualifications.

EDUC 5200: Preferred: Preference will be given to applicants with Catholic Religious teaching experience

EDUC 5201: Preferred: Preference will be given to applicants that have studies related to educational philosophy; teaching experience (K-12, extracurricular or alternative learning settings)

EDUC 5202: Required: Teaching experience K-12 or experience with classroom management. Preferred: Interest in social justice education or background in Social Studies would be an asset.

EDUC 5203: Preferred: Preference given to applicants with background in educational/development psychology; Degree in Psychology would be an asset.

EDUC 5204: Required: Must have good communication skills; Must be able to navigate/utilize Brightspace for instructional and communicative purposes. Preferred: Preference will be given to applicants who have a background in special education.

EDUC 5207: Required: Good communication skills with diverse student body; ability to monitor on-line discussions and to fulfill all duties on campus. Interest in teacher education and K-12 education; Liaison with Chinese RLP participants to prepare for arrival on campus; Preferred: Bilingual competence in English and Chinese will be an asset.

EDUC 5210: Preferred: Preference will be given to applicants with classroom management or classroom teaching experience

EDUC 5212: Required: Must have strong communication; Interests in issues related to race, racism, and anti-oppressive education.

EDUC 5213: Required: Background with teaching culturally and linguistically diverse students

EDUC 5218: Required: Experience in Physical Education (K-12); Experience with Brightspace; Knowledge of OPHEA guidelines and website contents; Knowledge of Ontario Physical and Health Education Curriculum

EDUC 5314: Required: Teaching experience at secondary level; some knowledge of language and literacy development/instruction

EDUC 5356: Required: Strong background in Literature; Preferred: Preference will be given to applicants with strong written and oral skills; Excellent computer skills to support Brightspace

EDUC 5403: Required: Experience with K-12 Education and familiarity with gender and sexuality issues in educational spaces. Preferred: Experience with Brightspace; Experience with coding or website design would be an asset

EDUC 5405/5316: Required: Background or interest in Music and Music Education; Excellent writing skills

EDUC 5408: Required: Background in mental health, social and emotional learning, psychology within educational contexts

EDUC 5317: Required: Must have background in PJ teaching with classroom experience; good understanding of elementary science curriculum in Ontario; Good assessment and evaluation skill to provide meaningful feedback.

EDUC 5318: Preferred: Preference will be given to applicants with assessment experience

EDUC 5374/5376: Required: Degree in Physics or Chemistry

"With respect to those students who have applied for and been accepted for Assistantships, the Assistant will not be paid for any shortfall of hours at the end of their respective program, provided the University has satisfied its obligation to post available positions each term in writing and on the AAU website and to offer the minimum terms of support in accordance with Article 13:01 (a) & (b) **and provided that the Assistant has applied in writing or via e-mail by the application deadline for each term until they have received the minimum terms of support in accordance with Article 13:01 (a) & (b).**"
