Winter 2026 semester

In accordance with Article 12:01 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement the Faculty of Education invites applications for GA positions for the Winter 2026 semester.

The total number of projected available Graduate Assistantship positions the Winter 2026 is 6 GAs for a total of 840 hours. All positions are subject to sufficient enrolment and final budgetary approval.

Expected GA duties:

Projected duties are in accordance with article 14:03.

Assistants cannot commence their GA/TA duties until email confirmation of the approval of their contract is received from Human Resources (email titled “Authorization to Commence GA/TA Duties”).

GA employees are expected to make themselves available to report for all assigned duties, **both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties**. Most classes across the University are held face-to-face on campus and even online classes may require on-campus face-to-face duties.

Eligibility requirements:

Successful applicants must be available to attend at the specified time of the course/lab/exams and to report for all assigned duties, which may include both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties.

GA appointments will be offered to qualified applicants in accordance with the criteria specified in Article 12:03 of the CUPE4580 Collective Agreement.

To be eligible for a Graduate Assistantship you must be a **registered fulltime graduate student**:

- must be registered for the term of work at the time of hiring
- must maintain **fulltime** registration throughout the term and must be in good standing in the degree program
- Must be legally eligible to work in Canada with a valid social insurance number. International students must hold a valid study permit and meet all IRCC regulations to accept employment on campus

GA appointments cannot exceed for **the Winter 2026 term period (Jan. 1st to Apr. 30th)**. Refer to Articles 12, 13, and 14 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement for eligibility details.

Required essential qualifications: Successful applicants must meet all essential qualifications identified below as “required”. Qualifications marked as ‘preferred’ will only be considered if there are two or more qualified applicants who meet the required essential qualifications.

EDUC 5203: Preferred: Preference given to applicants with background in educational/development psychology; Degree in Psychology would be an asset.

EDUC 5204: Required: Must have good communication skills; Must be able to navigate/utilize Brightspace for instructional and communicative purposes. Preferred: Preference will be given to applicants who have a background in special education.

EDUC 5206: Preferred: Preference will be given to applicants with Indigenous cultural knowledge

EDUC 5218: Required: Experience in Physical Education (K-12); Experience with Brightspace; Knowledge of OPHEA guidelines and website contents; Knowledge of Ontario Physical and Health Education Curriculum

EDUC 5334: Required: Must attend classes weekly (Tues/Thursday afternoon) Preferred: Preference will be given to applicants that hold Education, Literacy/Language Arts background (courses/degree)

EDUC 5318: Preferred: Hold B.Ed. (Primary Junior Division); Familiar with Ontario P/J curriculum; Strong communication skills

"With respect to those students who have applied for and been accepted for Assistantships, the Assistant will not be paid for any shortfall of hours at the end of their respective program, provided the University has satisfied its obligation to post available positions each term in writing and on the AAU website and to offer the minimum terms of support in accordance with Article 13:01 (a) & (b) **and provided that the Assistant has applied in writing or via e-mail by the application deadline for each term until they have received the minimum terms of support in accordance with Article 13:01 (a) & (b).**"
