Its 2020 masterplan identified Sustainable Development as the top priority guiding its strategic vision. Campus decarbonization would be key to support this direction, and no small task: TMU's new medical school is set to expand west outside the city centre; its core urban campus relies on a steam system servicing inefficient buildings in use for over 40 years; and aspirational municipal and federal carbon targets are creating mounting pressure for a comprehensive decarbonization plan. How will the energy and sustainability team establish a net zero campus decarbonization plan and gain executive buy-in? Animesh Roy, Energy Manager at TMU, will present key steps and lessons learned: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adopting a "bottom up, top down" technical lens that captures building and district needs together to support an overall business case. • Identifying priorities, clear pathways and outcomes that support the strategic vision, using campus-wide submetering and decarbonization feasibility studies. • Creating demand for initiatives throughout the journey, using surveys, committees, and clear internal communication mechanisms to align and engage students, faculty, administration, and the executive team.
