Student Needs/Challenges Timeline



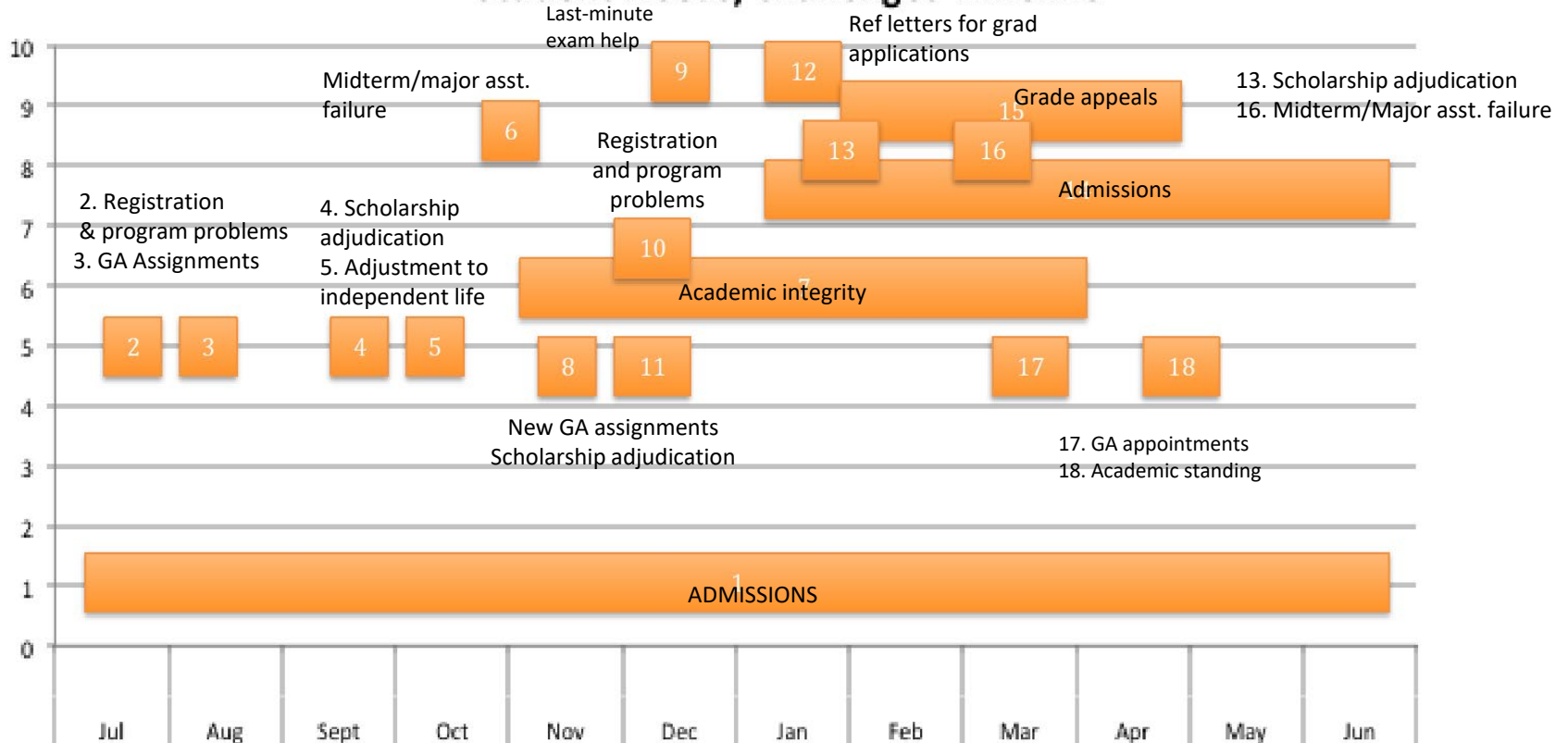
Graduate Students

Student Needs/Challenges Timeline

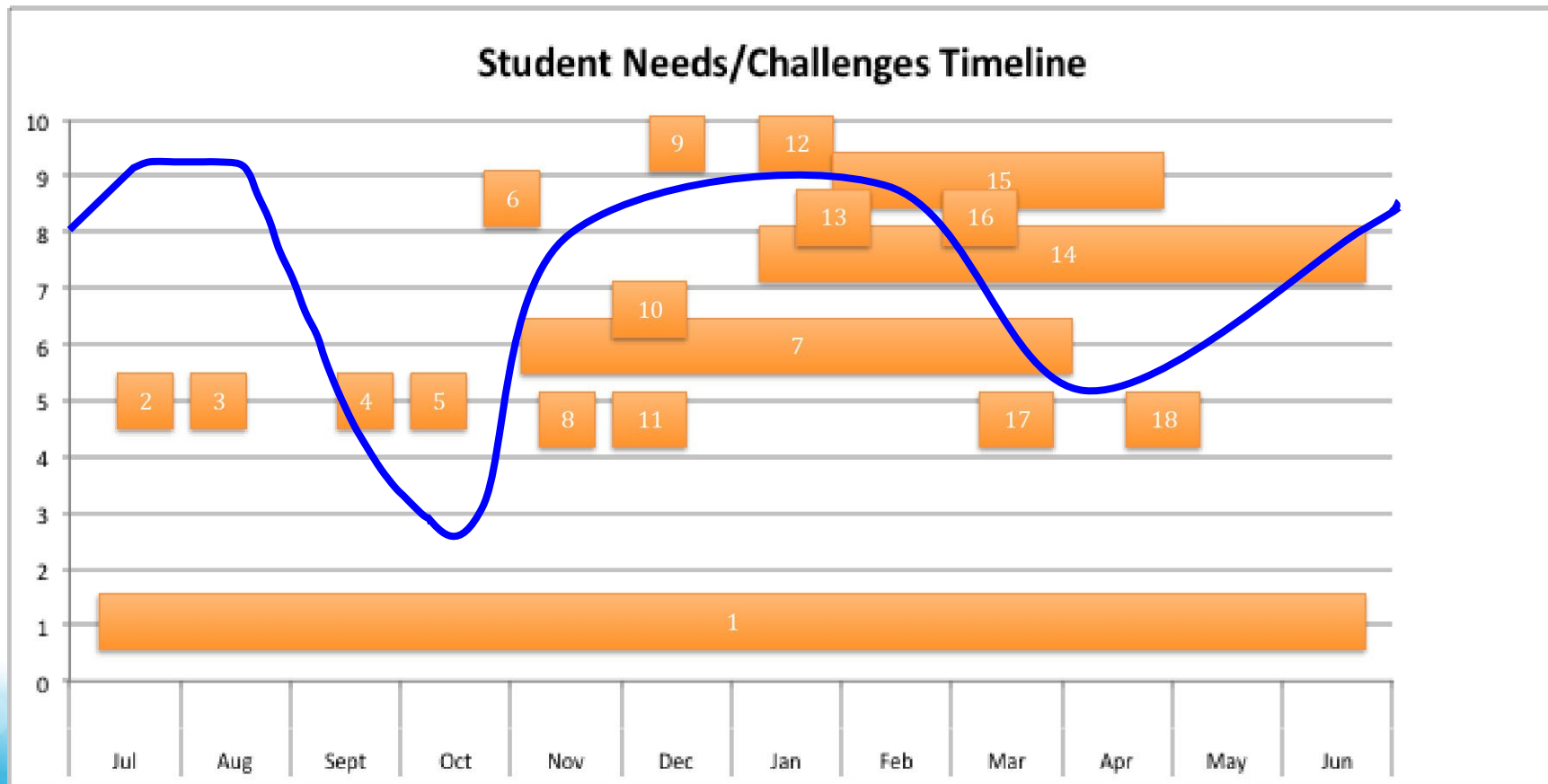
