Preventing sexual violence with pro-social bystander intervention.

It is our goal to offer education on sexual violence and pro-social bystander to as many UWindsor students as possible each year. This is one way that we are aiming for campus-wide social change around sexual violence.

Our program includes both the *Bringing in the Bystander*[®] workshop and two academic courses.

Our courses are cross listed in a wide variety of faculties. Our home is in Women & Gender Studies, but the courses can be listed as: SWRK,

Students who take both courses can become facilitators for the *Bringing in the Bystander*[®] workshop, and participate in campus-wide efforts to reduce sexual violence.

The *Bringing in the Bystander*[®] workshop is integrated into many UWindsor courses as a bonus mark opportunity – students who complete the workshop can earn bonus points for select courses each semester.

The University of Windsor Bystander Initiative[®] has unparalleled institutionalization, making Bystander[®] the only program of it's kind in Canada.
