Affiliations:

A portion of the monthly dues collected by WUFA is forwarded to the following affiliates, who in turn support and lobby for post-secondary learning and labour issues at provincial, national and international levels. Canadian Association of University Teachers

WUFA — What is it?

WUFA—the Windsor University Faculty Association—is the certified bargaining agent for over 1000 faculty, librarians, sessional members and ancillary academic staff at the University of Windsor.

Membership is not compulsory: all pay dues — all represented

All full and part-time faculty and librarians automatically have dues taken from their semi-monthly pay cheques. However, to become a member of the Faculty Association of the University of Windsor, one has to elect to do so by completing an application form. Forms are available by contacting WUFA. By signing the membership form, we know that you'd like to hear regular news and information from WUFA, and attend/participate in WUFA meetings, committees and social events. Our main methods of communication are email, interoffice mailings and the occasional newsletter.

The Faculty Association has an Executive Committee who are elected every two years to serve the membership. The governing body of the Association is Faculty Council. The purpose of the Council is to provide a forum for regular discussion of matters affecting the Association, develop new policies for the Association and ratify reports to be transmitted to the general membership.

WUFA services

WUFA's purpose is to assist its members with employment matters. Dues from members are the sole source of income for this non-profit organization. The Association negotiates the terms of the Collective Agreement with the employer every 3-4 years, and works to ensure that the negotiated terms of employment are met in a fair and reasonable manner.

These are just some of the services WUFA offers to members:

- Information for candidates considering employment at the University of Windsor
- Social events, general membership meetings, support for committees that work to address various workplace concerns, communication about everchanging employment and labour issues, and ongoing dialogue with management to help resolve issues facing members
- Information and support for those involved with promotion, tenure and renewal, including help with appeals concerning these or other internal issues
- Advice and friendly, helpful support on employment issues with management or other colleagues
- Information and guidance concerning Maternity and Parental Leaves, Leaves of Absence, Sabbaticals and other leaves
- Information on resignations and voluntary contract termination, and planning seminars in conjunction with Human Resources for those approaching retirement
- Advice on pension issues and health/dental insurance entitlements
- Grievance and dispute resolution
- AIG Canada Auto and Home Group Insurance
