

SENATE POLICY

Policy on Minors

(Inception as common University-wide policy: December 17, 1997)

(Amended: 1999-2000 (UC), 2000-2001 (UC), March 17, 2004, March 13, 2015)

A minor is not required but is available in most subject areas. See the individual program sections for availability of a minor in a specific discipline. A minor normally requires the completion of six courses as specified by the regulations of individual programs, and a minimum average of 60% in all minor courses.* Courses counted towards the major average calculation cannot be counted toward a minor, but all other courses completed for the degree can be used to fulfill the requirements for the minor. [Courses offered by the Faculty of Engineering cannot count towards a minor for engineering students.] Courses counted toward a minor cannot be counted toward a second minor.

*Exception: The minor in Chemistry and Biochemistry requires an overall average of 67% or higher in all six courses with no individual course having a mark lower than a 60%.

Minors are included on the student's official transcript but do not appear on the diploma parchment.
