Degree Completion Programs

If you want to major in Disability Studies or Psychology, and you graduate from CYC with a B (73%) average or better, you may be admitted directly to a Psychology or Child Psychology General BA degree completion program for CYC graduates. Earn your degree in less than two years. Or apply to an Honours BA degree completion program for CYC graduates in Disability Studies, Psychology, Psychology with Thesis, Developmental Psychology, or Developmental Psychology with Thesis. Earn your degree in two years.

You may also apply to the Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree completion program for CYC graduates, which admits you to the BSW Professional Years (Year 3 and Year 4). Enrolment is limited, and the application deadline is February 1. For more details, visit www.uwindsor.ca/socialwork

Course-Based Transfer

Or, you can get transfer credit for all the CYC courses you passed with a B grade or better toward programs in all these areas: Communication, Media and Film; Creative Arts; Disability Studies; Dramatic Art; English & Creative Writing; Film Production; History; Languages, Literatures & Cultures; Philosophy; Political Science; Psychology; Social Work; Sociology and Criminology; Women's and Gender Studies; Interdisciplinary Studies; Liberal Arts and Professional Studies.

If you apply for one of these programs, you will get transfer credit for all the CYC courses that you passed with a B grade or better, that have been evaluated as equivalent to UWindsor courses.

With all these choices, deciding on your courses and your program can be complicated and confusing. No worries. Do the math! A University of Windsor General BA is 30 courses, and an Honours BA or BSW degree is 40 courses. Depending on the University of Windsor degree program you choose, you can earn up to 24 courses for your CYC diploma. So, graduate with your CYC diploma, and you can transfer to the University of Windsor and earn your Honours BA degree in two years.
