Four Faces of the Moon

An Indigenous photographer travels through time to witness moments in her family's history: the legacy of the railway, the slaughter of the buffalo, and the impact of colonial land policies. Watch Amanda Strong's animated short documentary on Youtube. (14 mins)

The Secret Path

An <u>animated film</u> adaptation of Gord Downie's album and Jeff Lemire's graphic novel is a retelling of Chanie Wenjack's heartbreaking story about his residential school escape. <u>Watch online</u> and learn about how his death set forth the first inquest into the treatment of Indigenous children in Canadian residential schools. Indian Horse

The story follows the life of Canadian First Nations boy, Saul Indian Horse, as he survives residential school, a hockey career and the racism of the 1970s. A <u>book</u> and <u>film</u> are available about this captivating story of healing. (106 mins)

This River

When the body of a 14-year-old girl was pulled from Winnipeg's Red River in 2014, it started a public outcry and renewed calls for a national inquiry into missing and murdered Indigenous women. View this film as it follows volunteers searching trying to find answers surrounding the disappearances and murder of their loved ones. (20 min)

Jaat Sdiihltl'lxa: Woman Who Returns

Heather didn't know she was Haida until she was 16. After visiting Haida Gwaii many times over the next twenty years, Heather realized she wanted to join her clan and receive her Haida name. Watch the compelling documentary. (14 mins)
