EMERGENCY SHOWERS

Consult the Industrial Establishment Regulations under the Occupational Health and Safety Act for detailed information and specific requirements and restrictions.

- 1. Emergency showers must be provided where a worker is exposed to a potential hazard of injury to the skin due to contact with a substance.
- 2. Instruct all employees, professors, students, volunteers and visitors in the location and proper use of emergency showers.
- 3. Emergency showers must be installed within 10 seconds of a hazard and with an unobstructed travel path
- 4. Emergency showers must be installed and used according to manufacturer's specifications.
- 5. Identify shower location with a highly visible sign.
- 6. Emergency showers must be easily accessible at all times.
- 7. Area around shower shall be well lighted
- 8. Emergency showers will operate with water supplied from the main water supply for each building.
- 9. Waste water from showers should not create a hazard.
- 10. Drains should be provided where feasible and/or required.
- 11. If drainage is provided, drain piping should be connected to the building's sewer system.
- 12. Emergency showers must receive full maintenance every 12 months (flow, spray pattern, volume, valve etc.). The records of these inspections must be kept.
- 13. When possible, construction and operation of emergency showers must meet or exceed the requirements of ANSI Z358.1-2004
