# **Guidelines for Student Who Wish to Enrol in Individual Studies KINE-4750**

If a student wishes to enrol in an Individual Study course, the procedure will be as follows:

- 1) At least three weeks prior to the end of the Fall or Winter semester preceding the term in which enrolment is anticipated, the student shall have:
  - a) Determined the topic and consulted with a faculty member with whom he/she would like to study;
  - b) Written a 1 page (minimum) -3 page proposal, including a rationale stating the potential significance or contribution of this study to his/her undergraduate program;
  - c) Obtained written consent from the faculty member who will supervise the study.
- 2) During the counselling and registration period, the Undergraduate Coordinator, after ensuring that all procedures have been followed, will allow the student to register for the Individual Study.
- 3) A copy of 1(b) and (c) above will be retained in the student's file. Upon completion of the study, a final copy of the report must be deposited with the Undergraduate Coordinator.

**NOTE:** An individual study will be undertaken in a topic area which falls within the realm of a student's major area of study. Approval for a study outside of one's major will require justification by the student and faculty supervisor!

A maximum of two (2) individual studies may be applied toward a B.H.K. degree.
