**STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP**

**AMOUNT:** \$2,000.00

**ELIGIBILITY:** A student must be enrolled or accepted for enrolment as a full time law student at an accredited University Law School for the academic year 2009-2010. Written confirmation of enrollment or acceptance for enrollment must accompany the student's application with such confirmation coming from the Admissions Office or Office of the Registrar of or for the Accredited Law School. **This written confirmation must accompany the application on the application form.**

**METHOD OF SELECTION:** A committee selected by the Council of the Law Society of Prince Edward Island shall determine the recipients of the scholarship each year.

**CRITERIA:**

- 1) The student shall be enrolled in two or more law-related courses at the University;
- 2) The student is ordinarily a resident of Prince Edward Island;
- 3) The student has demonstrated financial need; and
- 4) The student has demonstrated scholastic achievement in the previous year of academic study.

**PART II****CALL AND ADMISSION OF ARTICLED CLERKS**

11. A person applying to be enrolled and registered as an articulated clerk shall:

- (a) be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada;
- (b) except for a person serving articles or clerkship pursuant to the requirements of subsection 17(1),
  - (i) have received a law degree in common law from a Canadian law school;
  - (ii) have successfully completed the following courses in obtaining such Degree:
    - Canadian Constitutional Law
    - Civil Procedure
    - Contracts
    - Criminal Law
    - Property Law
    - Torts
    - Ethics/Professional Responsibility
  - (iii) and have successfully completed 4 of 7 courses in the following subject areas in obtaining such Degree:
    - Criminal Procedure
    - Commercial Law
    - Corporate Law
    - Evidence
    - Family Law
    - Wills/Trusts
    - Administrative Law.
- (c) file with the Secretary-Treasurer a petition for enrollment as an articulated clerk and present a certificate of qualifications in Form 1;
- (d) present a copy of the articles of clerkship in Form 2;
- (e) deposit the proper fees payable upon enrollment as an articulated clerk with the Secretary-Treasurer;
- (f) present such further information and evidence as the Council may require.
