DESCRIPTION of ORGANISATION:	Students will work under the direction of a lawyer in the Justice Department of Six Nations. The Six Nations consist of the Mohawk, Oneida, Cayuga, Seneca, Onondaga and Tuscarora peoples, and is the largest population of all First nations in Canada. Students will be placed at the Six Nations Justice Department along with other justice related services. This is a multi-disciplinary department which has hosted social work and law students in the past.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK ASSIGNMENTS:	Work with the Justice Department of Six nations of the Grand River will be at the discretion of the on-site supervisor. Possible work assignments will include work on their MRP (Matrimonial and Real Property) bylaws, which were written and ratified in 2011. MRP bylaws need to be edited and formatted, then promoted with the community. The document might need to be turned into a plain language document and/or into community legal education. In addition, Six Nations has a Tribunal with three Nations who rotate mediators between them. Cases that are not mediated successfully or in which the agreement break down will go to the Tribunal on appeal. Areas of law include Child Welfare, victim services, family law, Indigenous legal traditions.
