

Windsor Campus – Teaching Opportunities

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS & PROGRESSION

- The Doctor of Medicine (MD) program is a four year program. Year One and Year Two involve didactic lectures, laboratory experiences, small group instruction, case based learning, simulation and supervised clinical experiences.
- Year Three is a 52-week integrated clerkship where learners become an active member of the clinical care team in the following medical disciplines: Family Medicine, Medicine, Obstetrics & Gynecology, Paediatrics, Psychiatry and Surgery. Students in Year Three are required to complete a community Clinical Clerkship rotation for a minimum of four weeks.
- The curriculum in Year Four (Term One) Clinical Science Electives (16 weeks) is arranged entirely by the students in any area of medicine at the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, as well as centers within Canada and abroad. The curriculum in Year Four (Term Two) is Integration & Transition (16 weeks).

- Year 1 and 2 observerships are an excellent way to get a firsthand look at the spectrum of illness in the community and to see the role of family physicians in the health care system. The timing can be very flexible and worked out between the physician and student. Observerships are normally a half day or a few hours in duration.
- Non-credit Pre-clerkship Summer Clinical Elective (NPSCE): A clinical learning opportunity during which a student receives at minimum of 30 hours of clinical instruction while interacting with patients in a clinical setting. It involves shadowing, observing, and participation in patient care under strict supervision by a legally licensed medical practitioner (preceptor).
- Non-credit Pre-clerkship Summer Research Elective (NPSRE): A structured research learning opportunity during which a student works a minimum of four weeks with a faculty supervisor in a research setting.
- Combined Non-credit Pre-clerkship Summer Clinical and Research Elective (NPSCRE): A Combined NPSCRE is primarily for students involved in a research project but who would also like to accompany the same preceptor during their clinical duties on intermittent days.

YEAR 3 CLERKSHIP (Medicine 5475)

- The Clinical Clerkship is a single course of 8 course weights. The rotations that are the core components of the clerkship are:
 - 6.1 Family Medicine – 6 weeks
 - 6.2 Internal Medicine – 12 weeks
 - 6.3 Obstetrics & Gynecology – 6 weeks
 - 6.4 Paediatrics – 6 weeks
 - 6.5 Psychiatry – 6 weeks
 - 6.6 Surgery – 12 weeks
- Teaching opportunities are available through all clinical departments, in different elements of the rotations

YEAR 4

- CLINICAL SCIENCE ELECTIVES (**Medicine 5401**)

- Sixteen weeks of Clinical Science Electives will be chosen in areas of interest to the students. Further information regarding this part of the curriculum will be provided separately.

- **INTEGRATION & TRANSITION (Medicine 5402)**
After completion of clinical science electives, students return to Schulich Medicine for the Integration & Transition course to incorporate the scientific and clinical aspects of medicine in light of their clinical experience. Offerings include a variety of classroom, laboratory and seminar experiences. Teaching opportunities include:
