1 BACHELOR OF MUSIC

This is a full-time program that offers intensive professional training. If your goal is a career as a musician or as a music educator, this is for you.

Our program prepares you, both academically and pedagogically, for success in many facets of the music industry. Training includes courses in performance, music theory, music history, ear training, ensembles, music education and music technology, as well as non-music options.

2 MUSIC COMPREHENSIVE

This degree stream offers the flexibility to focus on music performance or academic music disciplines (musicology and theory).

3 MUSIC EDUCATION

This degree qualifies you for admission into any Faculty of Education in Ontario, as a qualified high school or elementary school specialist music teacher. It also qualifies you for teaching music in communities, private studios and schools at all levels. UWindsor music education students receive the same high standard and amount of private studio experience as BMus in performance students.

4 CONCURRENT MUSIC EDUCATION/EDUCATION

Students accepted into this new program will receive both a Bachelor of Music, Music Education (Honours) and a Bachelor of Education degree in five years and be eligible to apply for certification to teach in Ontario.

This program is unique to Ontario universities, in that students complete two degrees in five years and can choose to study in the Western classical degree stream or the jazz/pop music stream.

PROGRAM ADVANTAGES

- A five-year program (as opposed to six) in which students are accepted into BOTH the Bachelor Music-Music Education (Honours) and the Bachelor of Education as first-year students. Students graduate with both Bachelor of Music-Music Education and the Bachelor of Education degrees.
- Students will be eligible to apply for certification to teach

in all Ontario public school boards, as well as an option to teach in Ontario separate school boards.

- Students will have the option to study in either the traditional Western classical music stream or in the jazz/popular music stream.
- Students receive the same high standard and amount of private studio experience as other Bachelor of Music students.

- Students spend their first two years solely at the School of Creative Arts taking core music courses (lessons, ensembles, theory, history) and music education courses.
- Students spend their third year taking their Faculty of Education courses (supplemented with ensembles and private lessons on your major instrument)
- Fourth-year students take their remaining courses in Music and optional second teachable courses
- Fifth-year students complete the Practicum through the Faculty of Education

5 MUSIC COMBINED HONOURS

For those who want to study music and another subject, consider our Bachelor of Arts Combined Major—a four-year honours degree that allows you to take two majors in one program.

Permission from both Music and the other area of study is required to take this program. Our program allows for equal concentrations of musical training and a broad variety of other disciplines. You may couple your music courses with such areas as psychology, French, English, history, communication media and film, and mathematics.

It opens the door to careers and graduate studies in many fields and the pursuit of advanced contemporary music making, music technology, composition and performance skills.

Composers and researchers with distinguished international reputations teach academic courses. You may audition for ensemble courses, private lessons on your instrument or take Music Technology courses.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

70% minimum admission average. The OSS Diploma and six Grade 12 U or M courses, including ENG4U, are required. Incoming students must pass a written theory test, based on completing Royal Conservatory of Music Advanced Rudiments or equivalent.

6 BACHELOR OF ARTS IN MUSIC

This is a flexible program that will allow you to pursue the rigorous, academic study of a wide variety of musical genres with the option of including a hands-on studio experience with classical or contemporary music.

The BA in Music is designed for those captivated by music and its role in social and cultural life. With its focus on academic study and the development of creative and critical-thinking skills, this four-year program provides excellent preparation for careers and graduate studies in music theory or music history and a range of careers in areas outside of music.

The BA in Music also includes classes for students who wish to pursue advanced, contemporary music making, including popular and electronic music and music technology. You can develop

composition and performance skills that reflect the diversity and richness of these practices, challenge yourself to be a creative and reflective musician, and prepare yourself for a career in the rapidly evolving music industry.

There are many possibilities for applied music-making in this degree. You may audition for ensemble courses, private lessons on your instrument or take Music Technology courses.
