Assistants cannot commence their GA/TA duties until email confirmation of the approval of their Job Offer is received from Human Resources (email titled “Authorization to Commence GA/TA Duties”, article 13:05).

GA employees are expected to make themselves available to report for all assigned duties, both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties. Most classes across the University are held face-to-face on campus, and even online classes may require on-campus face-to-face duties.

Eligibility Requirements:

Successful applicants must be available to attend at the specified time of the course/lab/exams and to report for all assigned duties, which may include both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties.

GA appointments will be offered to qualified applicants in accordance with the criteria specified in Article 12:03 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement.

To be eligible for a Graduate Assistantship you must be registered as a full-time **graduate student:**

- Must be registered for the term of work at the time of hiring

- Must maintain full-time registration throughout the term and must be in good standing in the degree program
- Must be legally eligible to work in Canada on campus with a valid social insurance number and a valid study permit.

GA appointments cannot exceed **140 hours total for the Fall term period (Sept. 1st to Dec. 31st)**. Refer to Articles 13, 14, and 15 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement for eligibility details.

Note: graduate students who have received a Graduate Assistantship Offer (“An offer of employment as a Graduate Assistant with a commitment of future terms of support under Article 14:01 (a) and (b).”) must apply each term until they have received all terms of support specified under Article 14:01 (a) or 14:01 (b).

Refer to Article 14 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement for details and eligibility. Failure to meet the eligibility conditions in the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement will result in the forfeiture of the term(s) of support.

Article 14:02: *“Financial support, as outlined in 14:01, shall continue, if the Graduate Assistant:*

- a) maintains full-time registration in good standing in the degree program; and*
- b) applies for posted positions; and*
- c) is satisfactorily performing the duties required.*

Failure to meet these eligibility conditions will result in the forfeiture of the term(s) of support.”

Required Essential Qualifications:

Successful applicants must meet all essential qualifications:

- Must have good communication skills and good understanding of APA.
- Must be available to connect with students through online channels.
- **NURS 3950:** Must be enrolled in graduate studies. Must have previously completed the course, NURS 3950, and achieved a minimum grade of 85 percent and demonstrates experience and knowledge in nursing research.
- **NURS 3960:** Must have demonstrated experience/knowledge in nursing practice and proficient in written English and academic writing as well as proficient in communicating orally in English.
- **NURS 4140:** Demonstrated knowledge in subject matter, proficient oral and written English communication and achieved a minimum of 80 percent in the course.
- **NURS 4571:** Strong communication skills, comfortable using Brightspace, responsible and professional; able to keep student grades confidential.
- **NURS 4980:** Demonstrated experience/knowledge in nursing practice. Proficient in written English and academic writing, as well as proficient in communicating orally in English.
- **NURS 4999-60:** Completed RN Prescribing course or is a student in the Nurse Practitioner program.
- **Simulation Lab:** Must have current/recent experience/knowledge in the course subject matter (e.g., acute care nursing) and proficient in communicating orally in English.
- **NURS 8400:** Enrolled in the PhD Nursing program. Proficient written and oral English communication and experience with course content.
- **NURS 8410:** Must have completed a master’s degree in nursing and course knowledge.
- **NURS 8460:** Must have completed a master’s degree in nursing.
- **NURS 8800-1:** Must be a PhD Nursing student/candidate with scholarly writing experience.

Preferred Qualifications

- Preference will be given to applicants who have background in the course area and achieved have a minimum GPA of 80 percent.
- **NURS 3950:** Significant progress in graduate studies, significant experience in nursing research.
- **NURS 3960:** Community health nursing experience and been a GA for this course in the past.
- **NURS 4140:** Previous GA experience with this course, able to lecture and good clinical background.
- **NURS 4980:** Experience in palliative care nursing and being a GA for NURS 4980 in prior terms.
- **NURS 4990:** Experience with APA and poster presentations.
- **NURS 4999-60:** Completed RN prescribing program or is a student in the Nurse Practitioner program.
- **Simulation Lab:** Has worked in the Simulation Lab (as a Peer Mentor) OR General Lab.

- **NURS 8400:** Experience in Knowledge Synthesis and Evidence implementation. Has previous GA experience. Has previous experience with marking, lecturing, and providing written instructions.
- **NURS 8410:** Has been a GA for this course in prior term(s) and has interest in research methods.
- **NURS 8460:** Has an interest in nursing education, teaching and learning, and/or teaching experience.
- **NURS 8800-1:** Scholarly writing skills, APA 7th edition and having a policy analysis background.
