Expected TA duties:

Projected duties are in accordance with article 15:03.

Assistants cannot commence their GA/TA duties until email confirmation of the approval of their contract is received from Human Resources (email titled “Authorization to Commence GA/TA Duties”, article 13:05).

TA employees are expected to make themselves available to report for all assigned duties, both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties. Most classes across the University are held face-to-face on campus, and even online classes may require on-campus face-to-face duties.

Eligibility requirements:

Successful applicants must be available to attend at the specified time of the course/lab/exams as well as to report for all assigned duties, which may include both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties.

TA appointments shall be offered to qualified applicants in accordance with the criteria specified in Article 13:04 of the CUPE4580 Collective Agreement. To be eligible for employment as a Teaching Assistant in the term of support you must be a registered undergraduate student:

- must be registered for the term of work at the time of hiring
- must maintain registration throughout the term and must be in good standing in the degree program
- must be legally eligible to work in Canada on campus with a valid social insurance number. International students must hold a valid study permit and meet all IRCC regulations to accept employment on campus.

Teaching Assistants can be employed for no more than 100 TA hours per semester total per Article 15 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement. If you already hold or have applied for another TA position (in this or another department) note that the total combined hours for all TA appointments held in all departments cannot exceed 100 hours for the Fall term period (Sept. 1st to Dec. 31st).

Required essential qualifications:

Successful applicants must meet all essential qualifications. **In addition, you must declare any actual or potential schedule conflicts with your courses.**

- **NURS 1210-Lab Sections:** Third-year or fourth-year BScN nursing student; Have taken the Anatomy and Physiology course and achieved a minimum grade of 85%. Proficient in communicating orally in English.
- **NURS 1511:** Be in year 3 or 4 of the BScN program with a minimum of 80% in year 1 ELL courses. Demonstrated responsibility, accountability and professionalism (strict confidentiality of OSCE results).
- **NURS 1900:** Must be proficient with elements of scholarly writing; able to respond in a timely manner to student and course professor emails; and available to help grade assignments and conduct midterm reviews (in person). Must have achieved at least 85% in NURS 1900 previously.
- **NURS 2351:** Must have taken the course with a minimum of 80%; must have demonstrated experience/knowledge in the course subject matter; and must be proficient in written English and academic writing as well as proficient in communicating orally in English, etc., strong interpersonal skills and decision-making ability.
- **NURS 2420:** Good understanding of Holistic health.
- **NURS 2810:** Must have taken the course with a minimum of 80%; must have demonstrated experience/knowledge in the course subject matter; and must be proficient in written English and academic writing as well as proficient in communicating orally in English.
- **NURS 3551:** Good organizational skills and can complete work in timely manner.
- **NURS 3940:** Must have taken the course with a minimum of 80%, proficient communicating in English, great understanding of subject matter.
- **NURS 3960:** Previously taken a community health and/or public health course, either at the undergraduate and/or graduate level, to demonstrate substantive knowledge; have previous experience as a GA or TA in an undergraduate course (ideally years 3 or 4).

Preferred qualifications:

- Preference will be given to applicants who have background in the course area and who have a minimum GPA of 80% (with the exception of NURS 1210 Lab Sections where an 85 % or higher is required).
- **NURS 1110:** Prior experience in the course.
- **NURS 1210-Lab Sections:** Served as a Teaching Assistant for NURS 1210 or NURS 1220 in the past.
- **NURS 1511:** Has current/prior experience working in the Faculty of Nursing lab or who have previous experience as an ELL course TA.
- **NURS 1900:** Is proficient with APA 7th edition, knowledgeable of Leddy e-database systems used to research scholarly articles. Proficient with Brightspace tools, MS word, MS outlook tools, comfortable helping students navigate file conversions (example .doc to PDF).
- **NURS 2320:** Has med/surg or ED background. Is in Yr. 4 of BScN program with a grade of 85% in the Pharmacology II course and Adult Health courses (with grades in top 3-5 % for NURS 2810 and NURS 3830).
- **NURS 2351:** Prior experience and/or skills in the subject matter (skills); prior experience with skills testing or previous experience as a Peer Mentor in the nursing lab.
- **NURS 2810:** Are in fourth year of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BScN) program, have experience facilitating large-group review sessions, meeting with students individually, and proctoring and reviewing examinations.
- **NURS 3551:** Has taken NURS 3551 and received a minimum of 85 percent. Has peer mentor or simulation experience.
- **NURS 3830:** Ability to create groups on Brightspace to schedule examination review sessions.
- **NURS 3940:** Previous experience working with children.
- **NURS 3960:** Has prior experience preparing and delivering course material.
