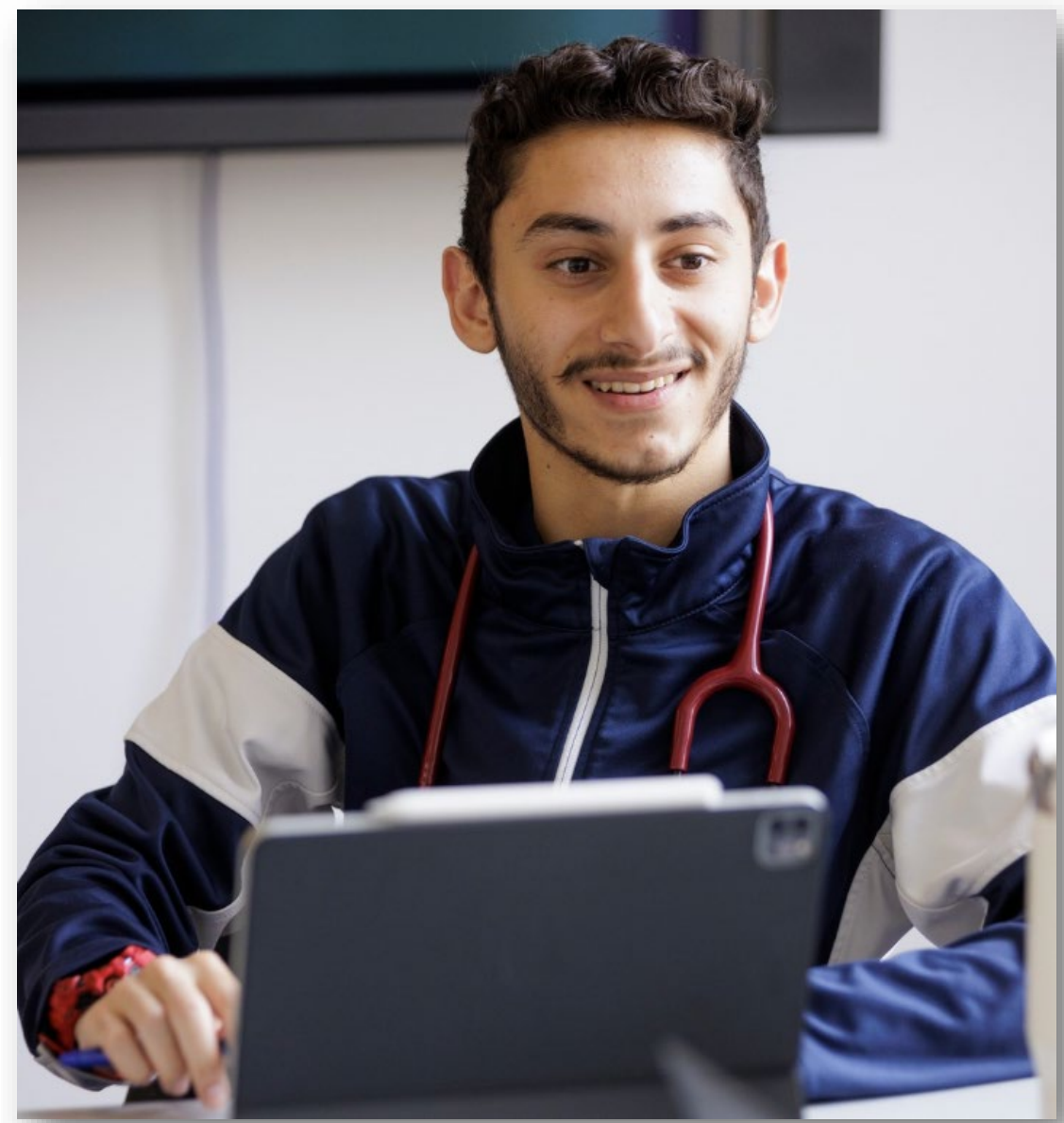

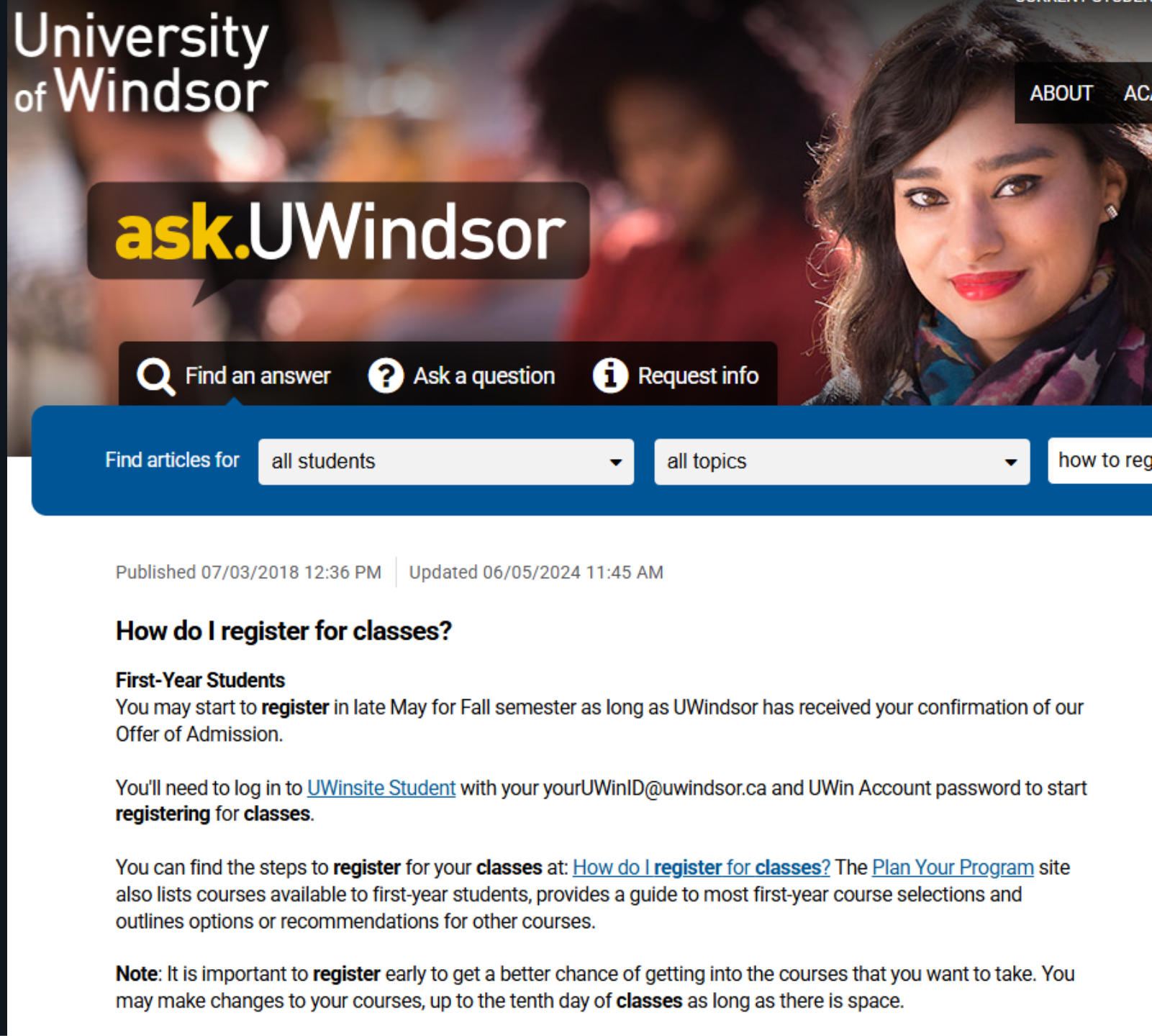

How do I register for classes?

First-Year Students
You may start to **register** in late May for Fall semester as long as UWindsor has received your confirmation of our Offer of Admission.

You'll need to log in to [UWinsite Student](#) with your yourUWinID@uwindsor.ca and UWin Account password to start **registering** for **classes**.

You can find the steps to **register** for your **classes** at: [How do I register for classes?](#) The [Plan Your Program](#) site also lists courses available to first-year students, provides a guide to most first-year course selections and outlines options or recommendations for other courses.

Note: It is important to **register** early to get a better chance of getting into the courses that you want to take. You may make changes to your courses, up to the tenth day of **classes** as long as there is space.



Tips for Success



- Review admission package – do what you can before September!
- Have a reliable laptop / PC for assignments & access to a printer
- Microsoft (MS) Word for Documents- download the office suite so you can either work online or the app on your computer. You will use MS PowerPoint (PPT).
- MS Outlook for email- create an email signature with your name, preferred name, pronouns, Faculty of Nursing, University of Windsor, and student number at minimum
- Practice using MS OneDrive for file access & storage
- Practice converting files from MS word (.doc) to PDF
- Using a MAC – tricks to viewing the ppt files on Brightspace – in the window you can select “view as page” and it will appear normally.

Tips for Success



- Set up your learning space so that it's comfortable and start separating your social time from your study time. Create a system to stay focused while learning in the classroom and while you are studying.
- Set up learning accommodations after you are registered and learn your responsibilities for exams
- Email with professional tone: "Hello Prof. Meloche,"
- Read and respond to your email at least 1-2x in a 24-hour timeframe. This is the expectation.
- Check Brightspace announcements and access your courses at least once in a 24-hour period.
- Always ASK your teacher questions and seek support if are unsure or struggling!
- Do not miss assignment due dates. Marks will be removed if you submit your assignment late.
- Complete all self-study orientation assignments on Brightspace



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Tips for Success



- Get your UWinCard (student card) & Nursing Badge (part of your clinical uniform) ready to go – can upload a photo to avoid long lines in September.
- Set up Important Dates for the whole academic year
- Set up your schedule using an online calendar if possible, reminders, and a to-do list
- Review muscles, bones in the body, cell structure
- Review difference between bacteria and viruses
- Practice spelling terms correctly by hand (no spell check)
- Think of study systems that work for your learning style- use active vs. passive learning strategies.
- Build a self-care routine – what does that look like for you?

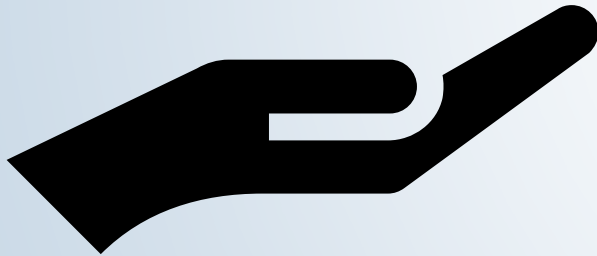

Intake and registration done online. Students are contacted by an advisor within the SAS department (by email)

When should I seek professional help for my mental health?

“I’m struggling... but I’m not sure if I need counselling”

You could benefit from student health, counselling & wellness services if:

- You are having difficulty with your daily living routine (trouble sleeping, eating, attending classes, feeling isolated etc.)
- You are having a hard time coping or adjusting to changes
- You are struggling with difficult or upsetting thoughts or feelings; or there is a troubling situation you are dealing with.

Students make appointments for many different reasons:

- *Excessive stress*
- *Panic and/or Anxiety*
- *Depression*
- *Relationship issues (family, roommates, significant others)*
- *Processing difficult events*
- *Boundaries*
- *Substance use*
- *Disordered Eating*
- *Abuse (verbal, emotional, physical, sexual)*
- *Trauma*
- *Grief*
- *Suicidal thoughts*

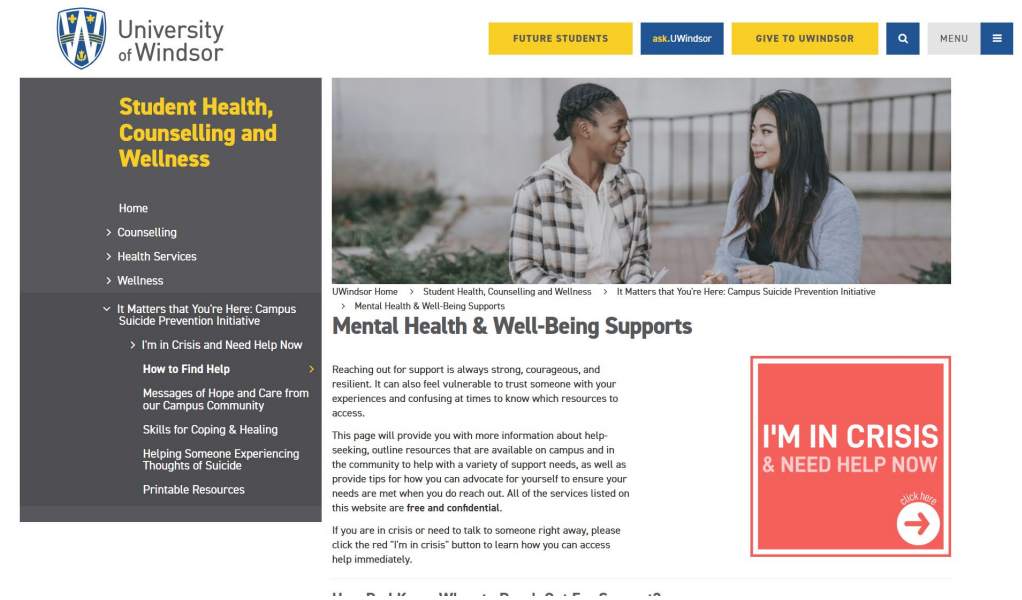

Pre- Clinical Clearance:

- Verified Synergy Gateway: You will get an email with the subject line: "Your Access to the Synergy Gateway Website" from the email address: helpdesk@synergygateway.com
- You must use your uwindsor email address and the password they send in the activation email to do your initial log in.
- On the Synergy platform there are helpful videos available under the Video library tab
- **Due date:** October 15th 2026
- Start early some requirements take a long time to obtain
- **For students who are not yet 18:**
 - you **cannot** get your Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) until you turn 18 years old.
 - You **can** complete all other preclearance requirements and complete your Synergy review appointment.
 - You will get a conditional pass for your VSC for 10 weeks after your 18th birthday
 - Please order your VSS as soon as you turn 18 as these can take 8-10 weeks to return

Clinical Learning Centre (CLC)

- Lab space on campus and virtually.
- Resource for students, faculty, and staff.
- Provides learning opportunities through appointments with peer mentors (in person and virtual) and open lab practice.
- A safe, judgement free atmosphere to ask questions about skills, clinical assignments, and much more.
- The CLC consists of the General (GEN) nursing lab and the Simulation (SIM) nursing lab.

General Nursing Lab

The general lab is located in Toldo and the Medical Education Building (MEB). These two buildings are attached.

The general lab consists of:

- Main office (Toldo 210)
- 6-bed practice lab with mid-fidelity manikins (Toldo 212)
- 6-bed nursing skills lab including a medication room with a PYXIS (medication dispensing machine) (Toldo 214)
- 4-bed practice lab with mid-fidelity manikins (Toldo 209A)
- 2-bed practice lab (Toldo 209B)
- 7-bed practice lab (MEB 2128)
- 8-bed experiential learning lab (MEB 3129)
- 2 primary care rooms with viewing station (MEB)

General lab information

- The general lab is open for a variety of hours to meet the nursing students' needs.
- We book peer mentor appointments so you can have one on one time with a peer mentor.
- We offer virtual appointments.
- The general lab provides support, education, and expertise to assist the nursing students to be successful with hands on skills at their clinical settings.

- 1-bed simulation lab (MEB 3134)
- Many high-fidelity manikins

Lab Kits

- Each first-year student will receive a lab kit which will include equipment and supplies needed for your experiential learning lab and preparation for clinical experience. The cost of the kit is included in your lab fee as part of your tuition. Lab kits will be provided in your first week of experiential learning labs.

- Wound care dressing tray
- 100mL Normal Saline

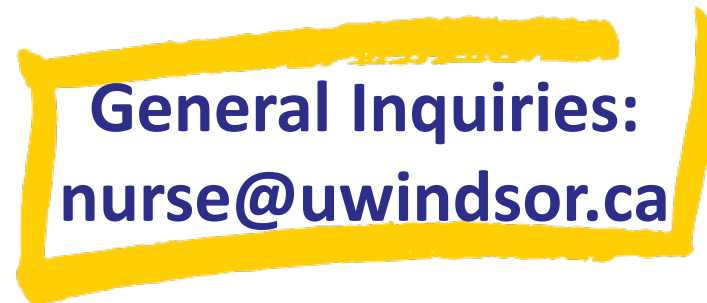
