Review of systems will incorporate the anatomy and physiology of the system and its relevance, and importance to patient/client care.

BScN and/or BSc degree required with a Biology major or anatomy/physiology related major; registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario preferred; teaching experience desirable; previous experience as Lab Demonstrator preferred. according to the setting; teaching experience desirable. Applicants for any Nurse Practitioner level course, must hold a current NP license. All applicants must currently registered with the College of Nurses of Ontario in good standing and hold no restrictions.
