### Sample: Full-time Student Course Schedule

Full time students must be registered in every term i.e. fall, winter, spring/summer. The four additional graduate level courses can be taken any time throughout the two years. Graduate level courses vary each semester. Full-time students must complete the program within three consecutive calendar years after the student's first registration. Full-time students will pay full-time fees even if taking only one course in a semester.

### Sample: Part-time Student Course Schedule

Part-time students can take only one course per semester. Part-time students are allowed one semester off per year without penalty. If a part-time student does not register for a course for two consecutive semesters without having completed a Leave of Absence (LOA), they must reapply and pay the application fee. It is recommended that part-time students complete the program within three and a half years and do not exceed the five consecutive year time limit.
