Dr. Maher El-Masri appointed Editor-in-Chief of the Canadian Journal of Nursing Research.

Canadian Journal of Nursing Research (CJNR), Canada's leading journal in nursing research and scholarship, publishes original research and scholarly manuscripts that are of special interest to nursing clinicians, educators, leaders, policy makers, researchers, and students; as well as other health care providers. Now published by Sage Publishing Inc., CJNR is committed through its newly appointed Editor-in-Chief Board to pursue a mission that will contribute to the advancement of nursing science and scholarship in Canada and abroad.

“As the newly appointed Editor-in-Chief of Canadian Journal of Nursing Research (CJNR), I, along with the Editorial Board have every intention to preserve CJNR's Canadian identity, while developing it to be one of the leading nursing research journals in Canada and abroad,” commented Maher El-Masri, PhD, RN, Professor and Nursing Research Chair, University of Windsor. “We believe that Canada deserves an outstanding and internationally

competitive nursing research journal, and that with SAGE's publishing expertise and its broad distribution among researchers and libraries, we can make the CJNR that journal.” The appointment of Dr. El-Masri to this prestigious role is a testament to the scholarship and research contributions of members of our faculty in the advancement of nursing science in Canada and beyond.

Doctor of Philosophy Degree in Nursing (PhD in Nursing) Launch: September 2017

The Faculty of Nursing's new PhD program was developed in response to the need for more PhD prepared nurses in Canada. The aim of this program is to prepare nursing scholars for the 21st century who will direct and carry out independent research, generate new knowledge, contribute to improving health outcomes and health services, and assume roles as educators in undergraduate and graduate nursing programs.

The program will involve four years of full-time study and is a combination of coursework, a comprehensive exam and dissertation.
