- Math Medication quizzes are due before orientation day. All math quizzes are online. See the NURS 3542 Brightspace main site announcements and the course outline for math quiz information and deadlines for completion.
- Before orientation, all students must complete the WRH Southwestern Ontario Hospitals-Student Placement Orientation. All students are required to complete these e-Learns annually, regardless of their placement location. This is the online orientation for **all area hospitals**. This is the student gateway for policies, forms, support services, pre-clearance medical and non-medical information, our course sequence guide, program regulations, and much more!

MEDICAL/NON-MEDICAL CLINICAL PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS

Over the summer, it is important for you to prepare for your pre-clinical placement requirements for your fall clinical. Please start this early as some requirements like the Vulnerable Sector Check (VSC) can take many weeks to process once you apply. Please visit [Pre-Clearance Information and Forms](#) to download the most up to date pre-clearance process information sheet and non-medical forms. Carefully read and follow the directions on the website. Appointments can be made through your Verified Synergy profile after **May 15, 2026**, to review the documents submitted. Appointments can take 48 hours to complete. There are fees for each review, so be sure that everything is submitted correctly to avoid unnecessary charges. **All clearance documents must be valid until the last day of your spring consolidation placement to pass your synergy appointment.** Please have your Verified Synergy clearance completed by **August 19th, 2026**.

NOTE: Basic personal information (e.g. name, email etc.) will be shared with our clinical agency partners (hospital and community agencies) for the purpose of arranging clinical placements and setting up electronic documentation. **Synergy Gateway Verified Inc.** is the agency that the Faculty of Nursing uses for our preclinical clearances. Information shared includes name, uwindsor email, student number and year in program to help set up Synergy Gateway Verified Inc. accounts.

Additional Information Regarding your Fall Clinical Placement:

- Students will be pre-placed in their year 3 fall clinical placements by the Clinical Placement team in collaboration with Coordinators at St. Clair College. The Faculty of Nursing reserves the right to move students if needed and to finalize all clinical placements.
- Day or afternoon clinical shifts may be required. Students can expect 8-hour shifts for fall and winter and may have 12-hour shifts during consolidation.
- Clinical placements are arranged within Windsor Essex or Chatham Kent County.
- **You are responsible for arranging and covering costs for your own transportation and accommodation (if needed) to and from your clinical placement agency or hospital (e.g., vehicle, public transit, car-pool, parking, car share, etc.).**

Student UwinCARD AND Clinical Photo ID badge:

Student cards and clinical badges are available after you are registered for your summer or fall course(s). The UwinCARD office is in the Joyce Entrepreneurship Centre beside the Career Centre on Wyandotte-close to the parking garage.

Student UwinCARDS are free, and the cost of your Clinical Photo ID badge is included in your tuition. The cost for a replacement student UwinCARD is (\$25.00). Clinical Photo ID badges are required as part of your clinical uniform and need to be a University of Windsor Badge.

Once students have their uwin id and student number the quickest and easiest way to apply for their cards online on their website. The same photo will be used for your student card and clinical ID badge. When picking up the student card please let them know you also need to pick up your Clinical ID badge.

SUMMER COURSE PLANNING

TRANSCRIPT INFORMATION

Non-nursing courses taken at St. Clair College previously will appear on your UW transcript as transferred courses with a grade of “T”; will not have your specific course grade. Exact grades from nursing courses taken at the college will be on your uwindsor transcript. Please note: your cumulative average on your university transcript will be different than your St. Clair transcript because the non-nursing courses are recognized at the University as transfer credits.

STUDENT HEALTH COUNSELLING & WELLNESS SERVICES

Student Counselling Services

The Faculty of Nursing is fortunate to have our own Clinical Therapist, Laura Little, MSW, RSW available for students in our nursing programs. Laura is part of the University of Windsor Student Health, Counselling & Wellness but works solely with nursing and medical students, so she understands the program and the specific pressure points of being in a professional nursing program. Laura provides completely confidential mental health counselling, consultations, referrals, and support at no cost to students.

When should I seek professional support?

Attending university is a life change and can present challenges. Outside of academic pressures, students may have to deal with stresses related to:

- Concerns about mental health (depression, anxiety, disordered eating, suicidal thoughts)
- Family issues/conflict
- Concerns around substance use or addiction
- Relationship issues/end of important relationships
- Illness or death of a loved one/grief
- Living away from home/loneliness
- Processing distressing events- current or past, at work or in personal life. For example, any kind of abuse (verbal, emotional, physical, sexual) racism, harassment
- Financial stress

Sometimes coping with one or more of these stresses can overwhelm our regular coping skills. If you find yourself needing more help, the Faculty of Nursing Clinical Therapist and the professional staff of the Student Counselling Centre are here for you. Remember, it is always strong, courageous and resilient to reach out for help when you need it.

Student Health, Counselling and Wellness offers a range of services to support students' mental health including therapy groups for specific issues (anxiety, depression, relationships, ADHD, etc.) single session drop-in, and short-term counselling to currently enrolled students.

We are your medical clinic on Campus. Our medical team of doctors and nurses provide a range of health services to support your emotional, physical, and personal well-being while studying at the University of Windsor. Caring for students is our number one priority. We place you first, work to limit out-of-pocket expenses, and seek partnerships with you in personal health.

Types of care provided include: acute care (sore throat, sprains, fever, flu, etc), physical exams (body check), minor surgery (stitches removal, etc), allergy injections, contraception, pregnancy tests, immunizations, sexually transmitted disease testing and treatment, counselling, etc.

Students who are transferring from another institution to continue their studies at the University of Windsor must provide documentation and register with SAS as soon as possible. In the meantime, reach out to your previous institution for your medical documentation as it will be needed at the University of Windsor. Advisors here cannot reach out on your behalf.

Having the medical documentation will speed up the process of registering for your academic accommodation here.

Academic Accommodations

Academic accommodation consists of arrangements that allow a student with a disability a fair opportunity to engage in academic activities and fulfill essential course and program requirements.

Accommodation does not remove essential requirements of a course or program. It does not fundamentally alter the content of exams, standards for assigning grades, or requirements that students independently demonstrate their knowledge of course material.

- **Academic Accommodations are directly related to a student's functional limitation**
- **SAS accommodates students in the classroom as well as when writing exams.**

Health and Dental Claims through UWSA

The UWSA, on behalf of its members, negotiates a health and dental plan for students who are not already covered under their own, their spouses’ or their parents’ benefit plans.
