

OPUS Welcomes the University of Windsor seventh President and Vice-Chancellor

ROBERT GORDON

Dr. Gordon's appointment was effective September 1, 2019 and follows his term as Provost and Vice-President, Academic at Wilfrid Laurier University which began in July 2018. Gordon, a leading authority on environmental issues and agricultural engineering in Canada, previously served as the university's Vice-President, Research. Before joining Laurier, Gordon was dean of the Ontario Agricultural College at the University of Guelph, where he led the largest agriculture and food faculty in Canada. Gordon has also served in various academic and administrative capacities, including as dean of research at the Nova Scotia Agricultural College — now the Faculty of Agriculture at Dalhousie University.

He held a Canada Research Chair in Environmental Resource Management while at the Nova Scotia Agricultural College. He also headed the environmental management section of the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture, where he administered the province's Environmental Farm Plan Program. Gordon earned bachelor and master's degrees in engineering from McGill University, and a PhD in Land Resource Science from the University of Guelph. Throughout his leadership roles, Gordon has also maintained a strong research profile. He has published more than 160 refereed journal articles, and has supervised more than 50 graduate students, and eight post-doctoral fellows during his career.

A MESSAGE FROM THE HEALTH PLAN ADMINISTRATOR

Dear Members.

I'd like to welcome all part-time and mature undergraduate students to the University of Windsor. As the Benefits Plan Administrator, I manage the operations for the OPUS Drug and Dental Plan including the handling of all student inquiries and ensuring that each matter is dealt with efficiently. OPUS has been proud to provide this essential service to students for over 13 years. Our benefits plan provider is Green Shield Canada along with the Canadian Federation of Students.

Our insurance coverage is based on a pay direct system where students are not required to pay up-front and wait to get reimbursed later like some other student plans. Students are only required to pay out of pocket and wait for reimbursement later during the blackout period while we wait to receive the enrolment data from the university.

We're excited that our insurance provider worked to bring BEACON to the health and dental plan effective Sept 1, 2019. BEACON uses a heavily researched and proven effective mental health support therapy called cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT). This service allows students to connect with mental health professionals and provide CBT digitally. Students can access BEACON through their benefits plan, using the psychology benefit \$500 per year combined, including \$300 per year for the BEACON program.

DIANA MARION




method as an alternative to reducing stress.

"Our hearts break today for all the families that have lost loved ones," said UWindsor president Robert Gordon. "We mourn as the world mourns with us at the loss of promise and possibility."

IN MEMORY OF 5 PLANE CRASH VICTIMS-OUR LANCERS...

The University of Windsor confirmed five members of their university community were on a Ukrainian passenger plane that crashed in Iran. Dozens of Canadians, many of them students, were among the 176 people killed when the plane crashed minutes after takeoff from Tehran's main airport, Ukraine's government said on Wednesday. The five wonderful souls—biology research assistant Samira Bashiri, engineering doctoral candidates Hamidreza Setareh Kokab, Pedram Jadidi, and Zahra Naghibi, and her spouse Mohammad Abbaspour Ghadi—had "unlimited" potential to add to human discovery according to various members of the university community.

The five were among 176 passengers, many of them university students and some professors, bound for Canada. There were a total of 167 passengers and nine crew on board Ukraine International Airline Flight PS752. All 176 people died when the Boeing 737-800 crashed minutes after taking off from Tehran's Imam Khomeini International Airport en route first to the Ukrainian capital Kyiv.



Future Planning


Prepare OPUS for future challenges, ensure financial stability, succession planning and innovative ways to secure and expand OPUS services and viability.


