What is Outstanding Scholars?

Outstanding Scholars are paid to do research outside of the classroom, working alongside faculty members on research projects! This unique opportunity lasts for three years, particularly in your second, third, and fourth years of undergraduate study.

Outstanding Scholars Mission

The Outstanding Scholars Program provides an exceptional and supportive undergraduate learning experience for high-achieving students, emphasizing depth and breadth of research-based academic inquiry, strong and ongoing faculty/student mentorship, effective communication of research achievement, and achievement of external recognition of academic excellence.

OS Events

During the month of November, OSSC held an Outstanding Scholars Informational Seminar on November 5th, 2020. The process of becoming an official OS starting in second year was an instructive discussion in the seminar. Here is some pertinent information:

- In May 2021, the top 250 first-year students (based on average) are invited to apply; this includes both OS and non-OS students.
- The invited candidates are required to submit an application that gets ranked based on their academic achievements, desire to get involved with research, community service and leadership.
- The top 80 students are accepted into the OS program.
- To become eligible to apply in May, a student must attain a reference and complete the Health and Safety in the Workplace training modules.

These office hours are held on Mondays and Thursdays at 4pm; the meetings can be joined by following the meeting link emailed to OS students weekly prior to 4pm.



Monthly Success Tips

As the University of Windsor is approaching the end of the 2020 Fall Semester, here are a few tips to help you excel in your courses:

- Stay organized
- Attend office hours
- Start studying for exams early

Stay Organized

In this online learning environment, it is easy to not realize you may have assignments and projects due sooner than you think. As the end of the semester approaches, review your syllabi to ensure you are aware of project and exam deadlines. Using a physical or digital calendar is a great way to keep track of everything you have to accomplish!

Attend Office Hours

Attending office hours offered by a professor or a TA/GA is a great way to clarify topics that you may have difficulty with. Office hours allow for real-time bilateral conversation, which prompts an in-depth understanding of topics taught in the classroom.

Start Studying for Exams Early

It is a great idea to start reviewing course concepts as early as possible as that allows you to effectively manage your time when you are very busy during exam season. Furthermore, by reviewing the course topics well in advance of exams, you will have more time to prioritize areas you are unclear on to effectively learn the content.

Upcoming Opportunities

Throughout the school year, Outstanding Scholars Students organize various events to support charitable causes and opportunities to network with other students. Here are a few examples of leadership development opportunities offered through OS:

Outstanding Scholars Student Council

The OSSC offers students the opportunity to help steer the OS program and organize activities for students in the program. Elections for all positions, with the exception of First-Year Representative, are held in March of each year to elect members for the following school year.

Outstanding Scholars Peer Mentors

The OS program offers incoming first-year Candidates an opportunity to be paired with an upper year OS! The Peer Mentor program is coordinated by OS students, and it offers Scholars the opportunity to help new students transition into the scholarly life of the university. This mentorship lasts throughout the Fall and Winter semesters.

10,000 Coffees

Outstanding Scholars are encouraged to connect with the 10,000 Coffees program, which helps connect students who share career and professional interests.
