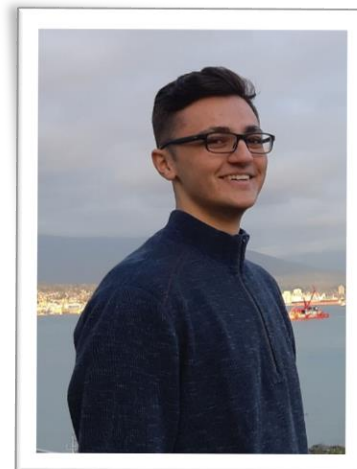
Although the program helped guide me in the direction of being a research assistant, the part of OS that was really important to me was it allowed me to get to know people

Stay Focused on Studying

As the end of the semester is approaching, you may be enticed to begin relaxing early. Stay focused for a few weeks as you finish all your exams so you can achieve the marks you want! After finishing the semester, there will be plenty of time to relax and enjoy the nice weather.

Double Check Your Exam Times

Before the exam period begins, you should double check your exam times and keep track of them on a calendar or whiteboard. You can check your exam times by navigating to UWinsite → "Manage Classes" → "Exams" → "View My Exam Schedule". You can also use reminders or alarms to make sure you remember all the respective starting times.

Create a Study Plan

As you check your exam times and keep track of them, you can create a study plan outlining what days and times you will study for each class and what curriculum you would like to study at that time. This will help keep you on track and optimize your time when you are very busy.

Upcoming Opportunities

Throughout the school year, Outstanding Scholars Students organize various events to support charitable causes and opportunities to network with other students. Here are a few examples of leadership development opportunities:

Outstanding Scholars Student Council

The OSSC offers students the opportunity to help steer the OS program and organize activities for students in the program. Elections for all positions, with the exception of First-Year Representative, are held in March of each year to elect members for the following school year.

Outstanding Scholars Peer Mentors

The OS program offers incoming first-year Candidates an opportunity to be paired with an upper year OS! The Peer Mentor program is coordinated by OS students, and it offers Scholars the opportunity to help new students transition into the scholarly life of the university. This mentorship lasts throughout the Fall and Winter semesters.

McCall MacBain Scholarship

The McCall MacBain Scholarships are Canada's first comprehensive, leadership scholarships for master's and second-entry professional undergraduate studies. Starting in June 2021, Canadian students and alumni can apply to join the second-ever class of McCall MacBain Scholars at McGill for their studies starting in Summer/Fall 2022.
