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(h) Ten courses (10) consisting of two different concentrations [Eleven (11) w/language concentration]:

In addition to the requirements above, students must complete at least ten (10) area of concentration courses, five (5) each in two different concentrations. Concentrations are offered in **Economics, History, Sociology, Gender, Geography and Globalization, Middle Eastern and Islamic Studies, Philosophy, a Language** [Arabic, French, German, Italian, or Spanish], or 5 relevant courses completed through a semester in an **International Exchange program**.

Completing a concentration as part of the IR program is **not the same** as completing a minor, as each concentration requires [specific courses for proper completion \(see the concentrations checklist\)](#). Students are advised to **consult with the Department of Political Science undergraduate academic counselor** to ensure they are on track and selecting appropriate courses to complete the concentration requirements. Students choosing a **language concentration** must complete six (6) courses to fulfill the requirement, with at least four (4) courses in the same language.

Students who started the IR program prior to the Fall 2020 semester must complete the requirements in any two of the concentrations below. Courses used in fulfilling one concentration cannot be used to fulfill another concentration, nor can they be used for fulfilling other core program requirements. Please note that some courses below may require additional prerequisites, and that we cannot guarantee that courses will be offered in any given year. Students are ***strongly encouraged*** to see the Department of Political Science undergraduate academic advisor for assistance in planning their concentrations.

**Economics:** ECON-2210, ECON-2310 and three of ECON-3100, ECON-3410, ECON-3500, ECON-3530, ECON-3730, ECON-3740, POLS-3550 (if not already taken).

**Gender:** five from WGST-1600, WGST-2200, POLS-2110/WGST-2110, WGST-2600/WORK-2600, HIST-3360, SACR-2040, SACR-2140, SACR-2150, SACR-3520, SACR-3530/WGST-3530, SACR-3540/WGST-3540, SACR-4080, WGST-3400/HIST-3400, PHIL-2360

**Geography and Globalization:** POLS-2300 and four of MACS-4500/CMAF-4500, PHIL-3230, POLS-3350, POLS-4400, POLS-4650, SACR-2270, SACR-3750, WORK-2600.

**History:** five from HIST-2020, HIST-2100, HIST-2110, HIST-2120, HIST-2180, HIST-2200, HIST-2430, HIST-2440, HIST-2720, HIST-3100, HIST-3200, HIST-3210, HIST-3400, HIST-3610, HIST-3630, HIST-4200, HIST-4620, HIST-4700

**International Exchange:** Any five courses in Political Science, Social Sciences, or Law, from another university taken during a one-semester international exchange (or 5 of 10 total courses for a year-long exchange) organized through the International Exchange Office during Semester 5 or 6 (year 3).

**Languages:** Six courses, at least four of which must be from the same language:

- Arabic: ARAB-1100, ARAB-1110, ARAB-2100, ARAB-2110, ARAB-2610, ARAB-2620
- French: FREN-1210 and FREN-1220 or FREN-1230; FREN-2210 and FREN-2220 or FREN-2230; FREN-2600, FREN-2700
- German: GRMN-1020, GRMN-2020, GRMN-2600, GRMN-2610
- Italian: ITLN-1020, ITLN-2020, ITLN-2600, ITLN-2610.
- Spanish: SPAN-1020, SPAN-2020, SPAN-2600, SPAN-2610.

**Middle Eastern and Islamic Studies:** POLS-2350, POLS-3650, and three of HIST-2100, HIST-2110, HIST-2120, HIST-3100, ARAB-2610, ARAB-2620, ARAB-3610, HIST-3100, HIST-4110

**Philosophy:** one of PHIL-1100 or PHIL-1120, and four of PHIL-2220, PHIL-2260, PHIL-2270, PHIL-2380, PHIL-3230, PHIL-3300, POLS-2510 or POLS-2520 (whichever not already taken as a core requirement)

**Sociology:** SACR-1100, and four of SACR-2270, SACR/WORK-3270, SACR-3330, SACR-3390, SACR-3400, SACR-3520, SACR-3750
