Research Data Management Information and Consultation Day

Expectations about research data are changing. Governments, research funders, publishers and academic communities are increasingly becoming aware of the value of research data and the importance of fostering digital data stewardship and the reuse of data in research. On the horizon, the Canadian federal granting agencies (CIHR, NSERC, SSHRC) are developing their own [policy on Research Data Management](#) (RDM) for funded research projects and institutions.

In the morning and early afternoon of **Tuesday, 26 November 2019**, join your colleagues for a half-day information and consultation event on research data management on campus. Currently planned are a series of talks by invited subject matter experts on Canadian RDM policy, working with sensitive and restrictive data, and on data infrastructure and storage. There will also be a moderated faculty panel discussion on the effects of the upcoming Tri-Agency RDM policy on researchers. Participants will have the opportunity to share their thoughts with [ITS](#), the [Library](#), [ORIS](#) and the [REB](#). Lunch will be provided.

Registration of Canadians Abroad

Heading to an international conference? Register as a Canadian abroad to ensure you are protected in the event of natural disasters, civil unrest, and other types of emergencies.



The **Registration of Canadians Abroad** service is provided by the Government of Canada to help ensure your personal safety when travelling. As academics, we are often in a situation where travel is necessary to disseminate research and share new ideas – and we don't always have a choice in destination for leading conferences. By registering before attending a conference or otherwise travelling internationally, you ensure that Canadian consular services know how to reach you in case of emergency.

[Registering online](#) only takes a moment, and can save you a lot of difficulty down the road, should you be faced with a crisis in a place you are visiting. The Government of Canada will use your contact information to apprise you of any emergencies that are imminent or occurring. **This is critically important if you are travelling to a location where civil unrest is occurring, such as Chile, Hong Kong, or Lebanon, or anywhere experiencing an ongoing environmental emergency, such as Los Angeles or other areas where wildfires are burning.**

In the event of an emergency, consular services abroad can aid in evacuation, help you contact loved ones, and assist you in other ways but **only if they know where you are!** Please take a moment to register before your next academic or personal travel. Submitting Grants/Contracts for Institutional Approval

The ORIS deadline is five (5) business days before the agency deadline unless otherwise stated. All applications for external funding must be submitted to ORIS accompanied by an ORIS Information Sheet and Checklist.

The purpose of the [Nanadagikenim - Seek to Know Grant](#) is to engage the campus community with Indigenous curriculum and pedagogy that can be sustained beyond the grant period as well to develop and maintain partnerships that support Indigenous curriculum and pedagogy.

Announcing the Schulich UWindsor Opportunities for Research Excellence Program



The Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry – Windsor Campus, in partnership with the University of Windsor, Office of Research and Innovation, will soon launch its **2020 Schulich UWindsor Opportunities for Research Excellence Program (SWORP)**. SWORP aims to enrich **undergraduate medical education** by enabling students from the Schulich Windsor Campus to engage in a research project under the supervision of a University of Windsor Faculty Member/Research Mentor. SWORP will provide funding for medical students to undertake a research project in any health-related area: biomedical, medical, or health-related research including basic, translational, clinical, health services or education research. SWORP is jointly sponsored by Western University and the University of Windsor.

- **Award Amount:** Ten awards in the amount of **\$5,000** will be available.
- **Award Duration:** In most cases, awards will be **18 months** in duration.
