4. Report from the Dean

- Recruitment Update
 - Applications (4356), admissions (2614), matriculations (169)
 - Science has participated in numerous recruitment activities since the fall:
 - High School visits
 - U Windsor open House (Nov. 5)
 - Parent's Night (online webinar)

- Discover Your future webinars (Nov & Dec)
- UWindsor Virtual Open House Day (Dec. 8)
- Educator's Day (Dec. 14)
- Plan Ahead Day (Feb. 4)
- Science Transfer Pathways Webinar (Mar 21).
- Spring Open House is scheduled for April 1st. Kerri Rice in the Dean's office working to coordinate and organize Science Open House plans. FIRST Robotics is the same day at the St. Denis Centre.
 - Discussed the need to clarify difference between the two Toldo locations
 - Need an Admissions booth.
 - Presentations will be limited to 45 minutes.
 - We will try to use the same schedule that we used in the fall. If you have any changes, let us know.
- Science is connecting with applicants:
 - Sent emails, Join Us at the Leading Edge booklets, Welcome Booklets and Alumni Postcards.
- Discussed Departmental recruitment plans:
 - Phone campaign will provide a room in the Welcome Centre. Let us know if you want us to connect you. Science has a general script that can be provided as well.
 - Physics uses an entering GPA list to advertise their entrance awards as a recruitment tool.
 - School of the Environment holding a webinar and then following up with an invite to campus for tour and activities a month later.
 - Science hosts a Shadow Day for high school students on every PD day. During March break there will be more opportunities for shadow days. If you need more information or know someone who would like to shadow, let Michelle Bondy know.
 - Computer Science held a webinar and virtual tour of campus for their MAC program.
- Michelle Bondy will be organizing a High School Science Teachers PD session for the public board. Science and Math teachers will visit campus and various departments in Science.

5. Report from Associate Dean, Undergraduate Affairs

- Working with Registrar's to get the Science Certificates on UWinsite Student by end of March.

- Final grade submission deadline is May 1, 2023. Please keep that in mind as this has an impact on graduation.
- Updates have been made to UWinsite Student over the past year. Students may need help with course equivalencies if they have been following incorrect information on UWinsite.
- March 15th is the final date to apply to graduate without fees. Even if their DARS is showing wrong, students should still apply and it can be fixed later.

6. Report from Associate Dean, Graduate Studies & Research

- External scholarships
 - NSERC CGS-D - announced in April
 - NSERC CGS-M - results announced shortly.
 - OGS/QIIGSST – Applications now with Grad Studies
 - NSERC USRA – New ranking form will be sent within the next week. If you have more than 1 student applying you will need to rank and justify your ranking.
- Internal Scholarships
 - Science International PhD Tuition Scholarships
 - Scholarships bring international tuition to domestic levels.
 - Scholarships are linked to the number of domestic student growth the year before.
 - Grad chairs in each department are in charge of how they allocate in each department.
 - Grad Studies Entrance Scholarships
 - Value \$7500 for 1 year of MSc or 4 year of PhD
- Grad Growth Incentive Fund
 - \$10K to PI to support RAships.
 - For any PI whose team grows by 1 grad student over the past 3 years.
 - Deadline is open ended.
- CFI JELF
 - Applications due March 31st.
 - Targeting early career researchers or those who have not had a JELF in the last 10 years.
- Research Chairs
 - We expect CRC announcements form VPRI soon.
 - Expect to make announcements about the Science Research Chairs and VIPR Research Chairs by Mid-March.
