

Ambassador Award

A Faculty of Science Student Award

Application Deadline: Wednesday, February 19, 2020

Purpose:

To recognize students who have applied and implemented knowledge and experience gained from their degree programs within the community. This award will recognize the development of tools, processes, initiatives or programs that have been applied within the community and have raised the public profile of the University of Windsor and Faculty of Science.

Criteria:

The committee will be examining the application packages for evidence of (but not limited to):

- Participation in community-oriented projects which highlight the University of Windsor
- Determining and responding to community needs by sharing expertise
- Collaborating with regional organizations or communities to create experiences that are beneficial to the public and the University of Windsor

Eligibility:

Any full-time Faculty of Science student at any level.

Nomination Process:

Nominations made by Faculty, Staff, Students or through Self-Nomination.

Application Packages:

Application packages will include:

1. Nomination letter or application detailing the reasons for submission
2. One letter of support
3. CV of Nominee

Review Process:

Application packages will be circulated to the Award Committee electronically for individual review. The committee will then meet to discuss the applications and reach a final decision. The Award Committee will consist of the Faculty of Science Executive Committee (or their designate), 1 undergraduate student and 1 graduate student.

Award:

The Award will be given to a maximum of two Undergraduate, and two Graduate students each year. Successful applicants will receive a \$1,000 and a certificate. All Student Awards will be presented at the Faculty of Science Student Awards Reception on March 12, 2020.
