<p>FRSC-1107-91</p> <p>Introductory Crime Scene Investigation</p>	<p>This course will introduce students to the theoretical background of scientific methods used in Forensic Sciences and their practical applications to crime scene investigation within the multidisciplinary Forensic fields. The focus of the course is exploration and examination of evidence found at crime scenes. The students learn the discovery, identification, collection, examination and processing of various types of Forensic evidence.</p> <p><i>DISTANCE EDUCATION</i></p>
<p>FRSC 3105-01</p> <p>Forensic Identification</p>	<p>Practical application of principles and protocols used in forensic identification. Topics range from the expectations of the public in forensic practices to the legal responsibilities of crime scene specialists for evidence identification. Fingerprint theory and practice, image capture and enhancement, crime scene protocols and management, biometrics, and identification as contrasted to systematics are studied. (Prerequisite: FRSC-2007 and enrollment in this course is limited to Majors in Forensic Science and BA Combined in Forensics.)</p> <p>Time: TBD; please contact mcioppa@uwindsor.ca to discuss</p> <p><i>Please be aware that this course may be offered using a combination of online (lecture) and in-person (laboratory) classes, or may be offered as a Windsor Online# course.
