- That the following amendment be made under Recommendation 5 in the Sociology, Anthropology, and Criminology document: "PDC notes that this recommendation, which speaks to both writing and research in early undergraduate years, has not yet been satisfied. PDC *directs*-urges the area to ..."
- In response to a question raised regarding the structure of Inter-Faculty programs, it was noted that, although it is not a formal Faculty, IFP has adopted the Committee and Council structure of other departments and Faculties. It was agreed that the issue of the structure of Inter-Faculty Programs is a separate issue that needs to be addressed by the Provost outside of the BAS program review.

5 Reports/New Business

5.1 Bachelor of Computer Science (Articulation Agreement) Major Program Changes (PDC Form B) and Response (See document PDC150528-5.1 and PDC150528-5.2 for more details.)

MOTION: That the Articulation Agreement Program for the Bachelor of Computer Science (General) and Qualifying Ontario CAAT (or equivalent) Students with 2 Years of Study in a CAAT (or equivalent) diploma program be approved.

NOTED:

- The proposal before the Committee was revised for grammar, appropriate and consistent use of the terminology (*i.e.*, CAAT (or equivalent) instead of college), and more information on evidence and data (sections B4.1 and B4.4).
- The agreement will provide students from eligible Computer Science related diploma programs the opportunity to be admitted into the University of Windsor's Bachelor of Computer Science (General).
- There are currently no existing agreements for admitting students who have completed only two years
 of a three-year program or have completed a two-year diploma program at a College of Applied Arts
 and Technology (CAAT) (or equivalent).
- Students who have a cumulative average of 70% (B-) or higher and have successfully completed Grade 12U Advanced functions, may receive up to 8 courses of transfer credit toward a Bachelor of Computer Science (General) degree.
- In response to concern raised regarding the issue that students will be receiving credit towards their
 degree even if they have not completed a full diploma program, it was noted that since this is an
 articulation agreement (rather then a degree completion program) students will still need to complete
 22 courses or more depending on the number of transfer credits awarded.

AGREED:

- The budget summary sheet should be amended so that the sum of the expenses is accurate.
- Additional information regarding math course admission requirements will be included.

5.2 Bachelor of Computer Science (Honours) Applied Computing (Articulation Agreement) Major Program Changes (PDC Form B) and Response (See documents PDC150528-5.2 and PDC150528-5.2a for more details.)

MOTION: That the Articulation Agreement for the Bachelor of Computer Science (Honours Applied Computing) (Co-op) and Qualifying Ontario CAAT (or equivalent) Students with Two Years of Study in a CAAT (or equivalent) diploma program be approved.

5.3 Liberal Arts and Professional Studies for Career Professionals – Major Program Changes (PDC Form B) (See document PDC150528-5.3 for more details.)

MOTION: That the Liberal Arts and Professional Studies for Career Professionals degree completion program be approved.

NOTED:

- The proposal provides an opportunity for college graduates who are seeking career advancement that may require a university degree to receive admission into the LAPS program.
- Students who have graduated from a two-year CAAT Diploma program (with a minimum average of 3.0 on their final ten courses at college) will be considered for admission and required to complete 20 additional courses for the degree program.
- Students who graduate from a Three-Year Advanced Diplomas from a CAAT college (with a minimum 3.0 cumulative average) will receive 5 additional electives toward their degree (completing 15 courses for the degree program).
- The Liberal Arts and Professional Studies program provides students who are interested in several fields of study the ability to take courses from a broad range of departments.
- Given that students need to take two courses from Business Administration, which can be challenging without a good background in business, it was suggested that some examples of courses that would be suitable are 75-100, 70-151 or 74-231.

AGREED:

- The degree parchment will read: BA in Liberal Arts and Professional Studies, since students who complete the program through this pathway will have obtained the same learning outcomes as those that enter into first year. However, it can be marketed as being a degree for career professionals.
- Other minor revisions were made to the document. (i.e., CAAT or equivalent, etc.)

NOTED:

- The proposed change will ensure that students complete their graduate courses over the duration of three semesters, as required by the Graduate Residency Requirements policy.
- This change will ensure that courses for the program can be offered by the department during the intersession semester as there will be student demand.
- Although exceptions can still be made for students to take 4 or 5 courses per semester (approved by the Dean of Graduate Studies), the department feels that this is not beneficial to students' learning and, it also impedes departmental offerings.
- The change will have no effect on fees as full-time students still pay for registration during each semester, regardless of whether they take a course or not.

AGREED:

• Clarification be provided under the rationale explaining that students are required to register in a minimum of three terms in order to graduate according to the Graduate Residency Requirements.

• The Special Topics course will allow Law to teach a variety of different topics as course sections under one umbrella course.

AGREED:

 Strong concern was raised regarding the issue that the area submitted a full set of learning outcomes, from which the instructor will choose depending on the topic. This is not in line with

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current practice and raises the concern that students in different sections of the Special Topics in Law course will be evaluated based on different criteria.

- By the end of the course, students should be evaluated according to the same learning outcomes, regardless of the special topic that is being taught.
- Although there is a fine balance between being too generic and overly specific when developing course learning outcomes, it is imperative to ensure that the learning outcomes are the same and transferable for each and every topic that is being taught under the umbrella course.

AMENDMENT TO THE MOTION: That PDC approved the new Special Topics course, subject to the development of generic learning outcomes, each one to be assessed every time the course is taught regardless of the topic, and subject to the approval of the revised learning outcomes by CTL.
