Strategic Planning: Student Consultations

- >665 students participated
- 193 optional demographic surveys were completed
- 89 student and 21 employee volunteers
- >21,000 data points provided
- Pop-up campus events May-July
- Virtual version beginning May

Next Steps....

- Staff world-café style consultations: Apr 20-21

- Pop up consultations (student, faculty, staff) will focus on gaps in the initial consultation data starting in May
- Meetings with faculty councils in Apr-May
- Topic-specific facilitated discussions in May-June
- Community consultation take place in June-July
